

Re; Proposed changes to Electoral Boundaries – Newstead

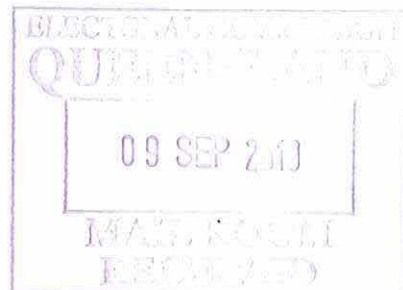

We are not in favour of the changes proposed by the Electoral Commission to remove Newstead from the Central Ward footprint.

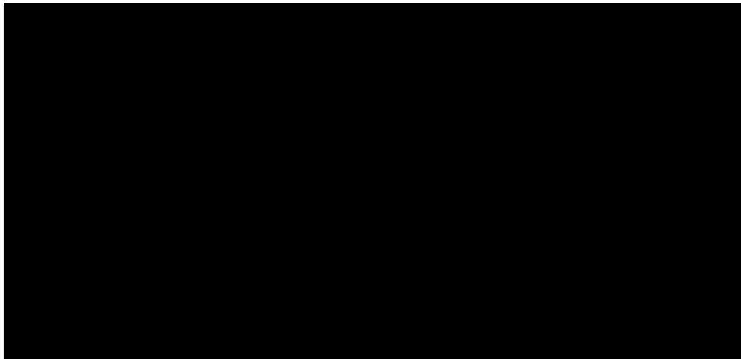
I have been living in the Central Ward for some 4 years now, some 2.5 years of that at Newstead. Before this I had lived for some 10 years in Clayfield.
