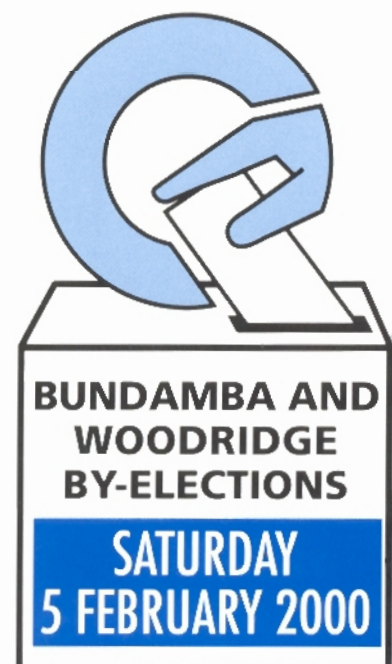

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

## Introduction

On 10 January 2000 His Excellency the Governor, issued writs for by-elections for the electoral districts of Bundamba and Woodridge to fill the vacancies in Parliament following the resignations of Mr R J Gibbs and Mr W T D'Arcy.

These are the second and third by-elections during the term of the 49<sup>th</sup> Parliament and the 371<sup>st</sup> and 372<sup>nd</sup> for the Queensland Parliament since 1860.

Both Ms Jo-Ann Miller (Bundamba By-Election) and Mr Michael Hans Kaiser (Woodridge By-Election) won on primary votes.

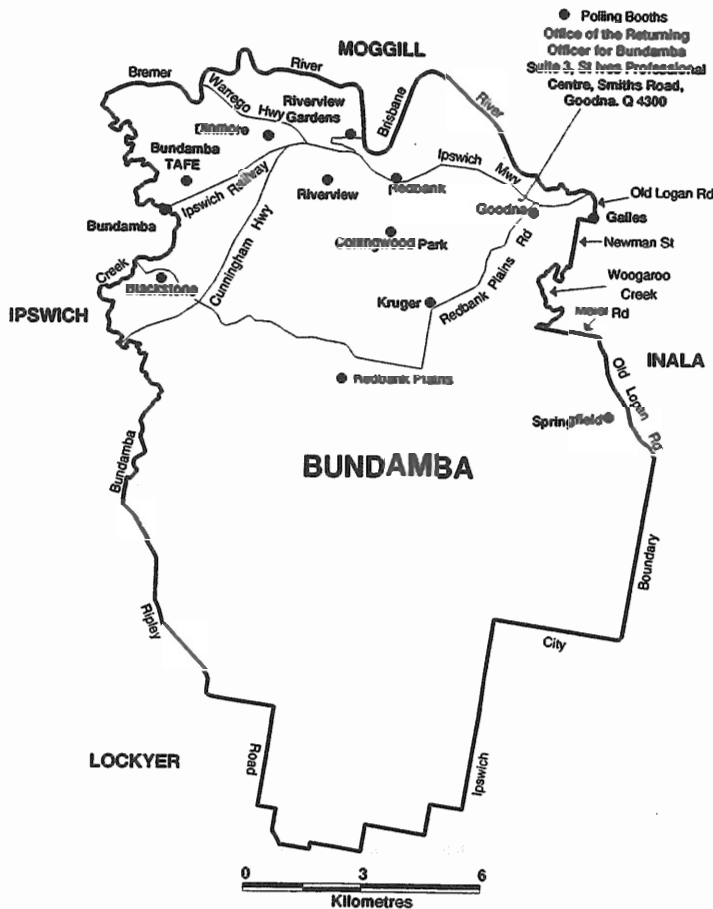

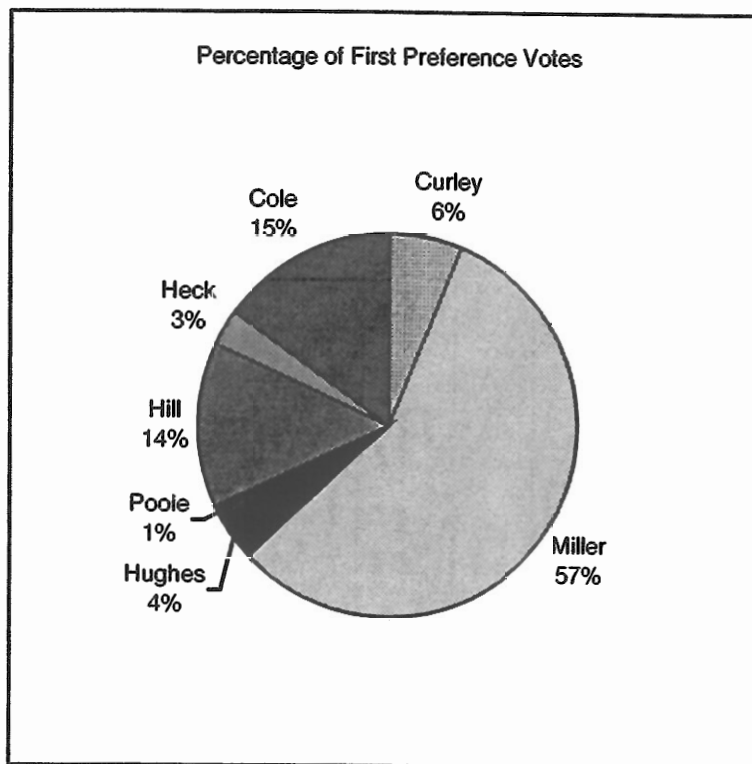

The percentage of "Live Votes at Each Exclusion" calculated for each excluded candidate is that candidate's share of the total votes remaining in the count before exclusion. It would be misleading to total these figures as if they were all percentages of first preference votes because there would be some double-counting.

The final row shows the division between Cole (25.73%) and Miller (63.20%) of the 5,468 (27.90% of total formal votes) cast for the 5 excluded candidates together with the overall rate of exhaustion (11.07%).

The final row shows the division between Miller (ALP) and Cole (LIB) of the 5,175 ordinary primary votes (28.23% of formal ordinary votes) cast for the 5 excluded candidates together with overall rate of exhaustion (39.00%). This table excludes 293 Declaration and Pre-Poll Votes cast for the 5 excluded candidates which were included in Table 3 above.

Figures are derived from the election night Notional Two Candidate Preferred Count which avoids the multiple counting of ballot papers required by the full preferential count as shown in Table 3 above.

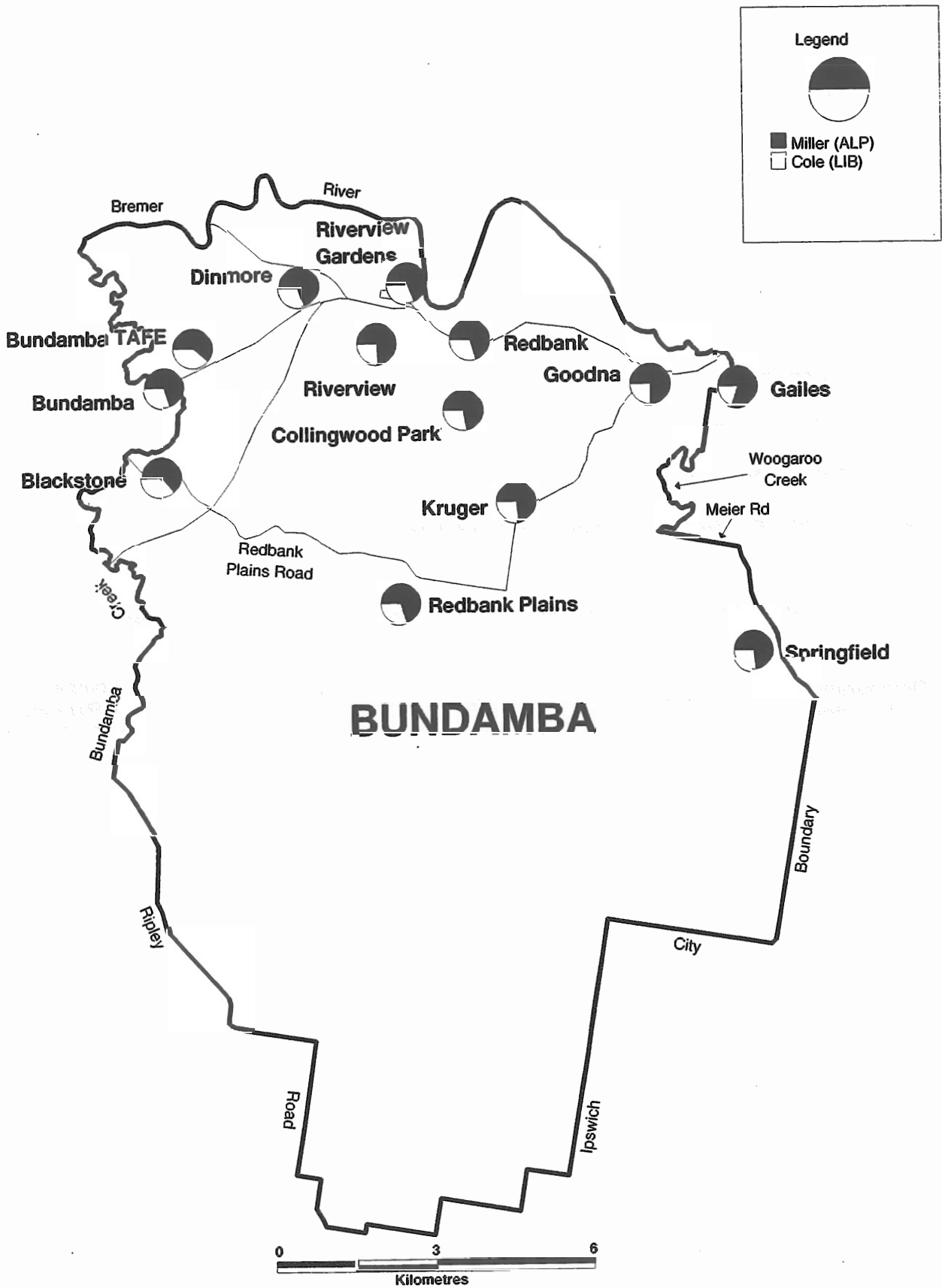

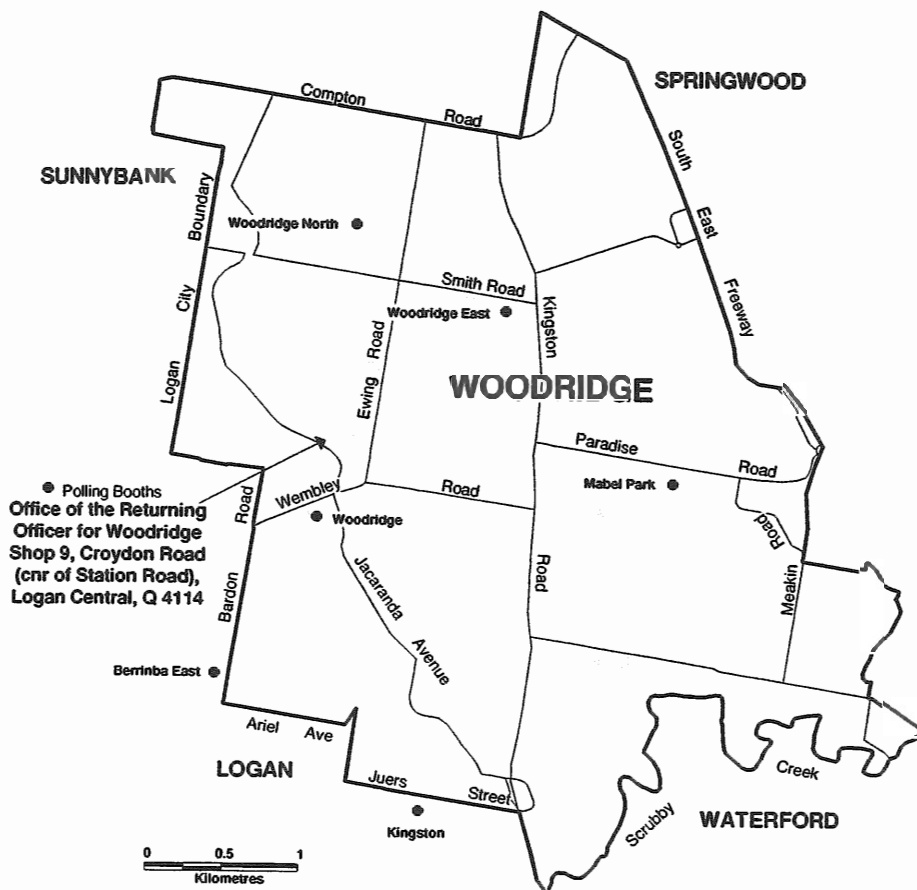

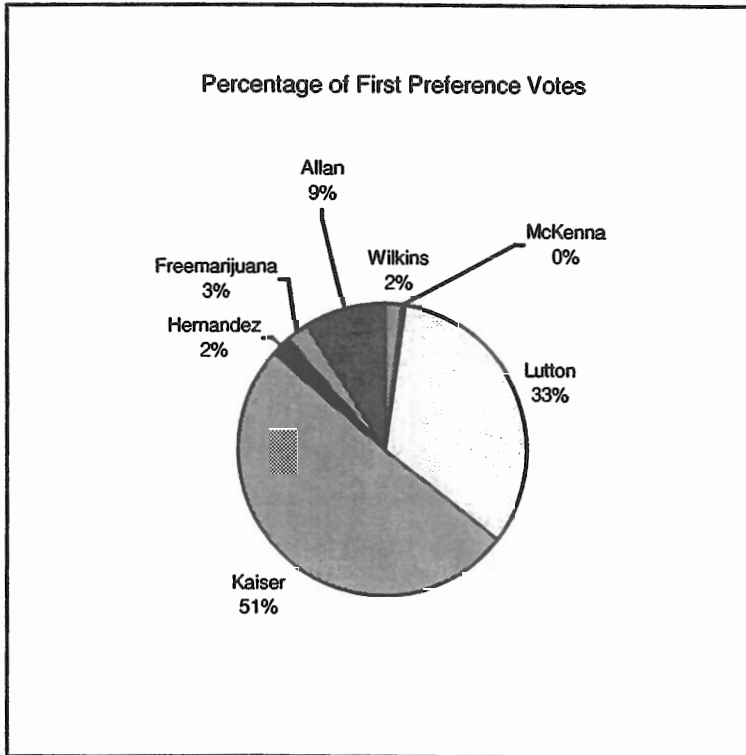
