



Lodgement of How-to-Vote Cards

*Intended for distribution
on election day*

(FOR A CANDIDATE **NOT** ENDORSED BY A REGISTERED POLITICAL PARTY)

Note: How-to-Vote cards must be lodged by the person who authorised the card with either –

- (i) the Electoral Commission of Queensland (ECQ); or
- (ii) the Returning Officer for the electoral district in which the candidate is nominated.

Lodgement timeframe

How-to-Vote cards must be lodged by 5.00pm on Friday that is 7 days before election day.

Note: How-to-Vote cards will be rejected if the ECQ or the Returning Officer is satisfied, on reasonable grounds, the How-to-Vote card does not comply with the formal requirements of the *Electoral Act 1992* (Act) or is likely to mislead or deceive an elector in voting under the Act. If a language other than English is printed on a How-to-Vote card that is required to be lodged, you must provide a written translation with this form.

In accordance with the provisions of the Act, it is an offence for a person to distribute, or permit or authorise someone else to distribute, a How-to-Vote card on election day unless the required number of cards and statutory declaration relating to financial contribution have been properly lodged.

Definitions

“How-to-Vote card” means a card, handbill or pamphlet that:

- (a) is or includes:
 - (i) a representation of a ballot paper or part of a ballot paper; or
 - (ii) something apparently intended to represent a ballot paper or part of a ballot paper; OR
- (b) lists the names of any or all of the candidates for an election with a number indicating an order of voting preference against the names of any or all of the candidates; OR
- (c) otherwise directs or encourages the casting of preference votes, other than first preference votes, in a particular way.

“distribute” a How-to-Vote card:

- (a) includes make the card available to other persons; but
- (b) does not include merely displaying the card.

Examples:

- (1) A person “distributes” How-to-Vote cards if the person hands the cards to other persons or leaves them at a place for other persons to take away.
- (2) A person does not “distribute” How-to-Vote cards if the person attaches the cards to walls and other structures, merely for display.

“statutory declaration” A person who authorised a How-to-Vote card for a candidate other than a candidate endorsed by a registered political party **MUST** complete the Statutory Declaration on page 4 of this form, relating to any financial contribution received from either a registered political party or from another candidate in the election, whether directly or from someone else on behalf of the party or candidate, in relation to the production of the How-to-Vote card.

“authorisation” of a How-to-Vote card:

How-to-Vote cards authorised for a candidate who is not endorsed by a registered political party, must state the following particulars:

- (a) the name and address (not a post office box) of the person who authorised the card.
- (b) the candidate’s name and the word ‘candidate’.

Example: “Authorised R. Jones, 1 Green Street, Brisbane for R. Jones (candidate)”.

The particulars in (a) and (b) above must appear:

- (a) at the end of each printed face of the How-to-Vote card; and
- (b) in prominent and legible characters in print no smaller than:
 - (i) if the card is not larger than A6 – 10 point; or
 - (ii) if the card is larger than A6 but not larger than A3 – 14 point; or
 - (iii) if the card is larger than A3 – 20 point.

The maximum penalty for distribution of How-to-Vote cards that do NOT comply with the above authorisation requirements is:

- (a) for an individual – 20 penalty units; OR
- (b) for a corporation – 85 penalty units.
