

# 2021 Stretton State By-election

## Election information

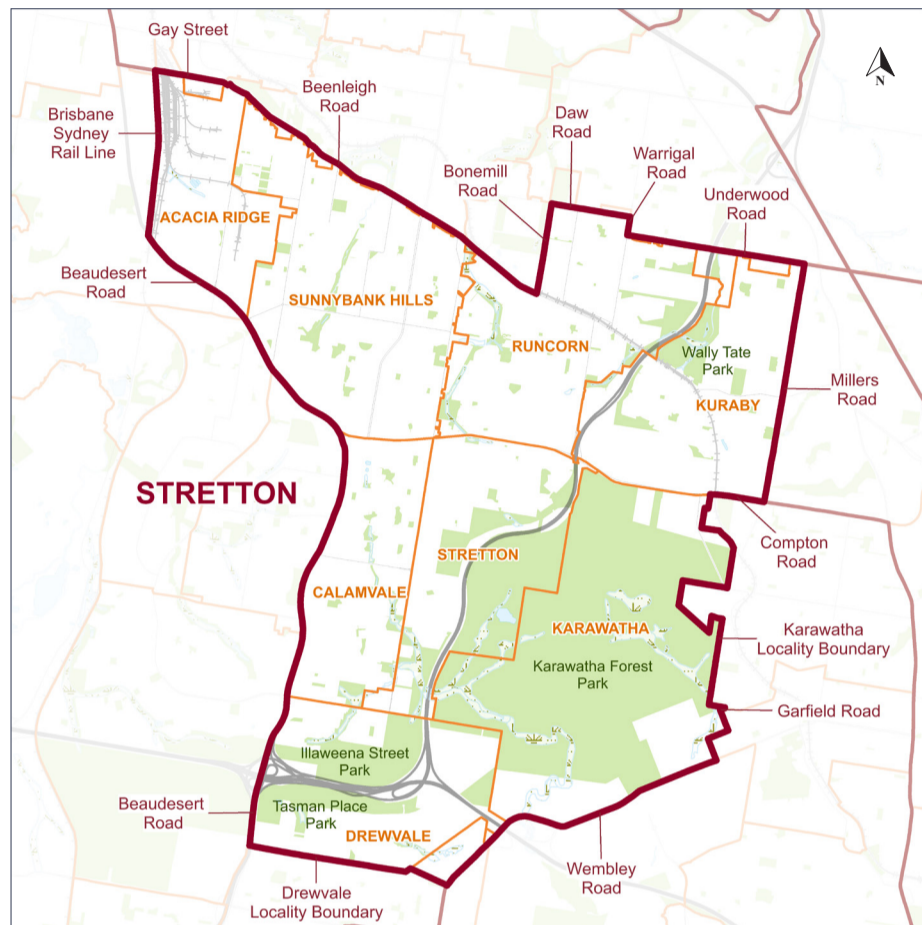
### Stretton State by-election on 24 July 2021

There is a by-election in the State electorate of Stretton to elect a new member to the Queensland Parliament.

You might live in the electorate called Stretton, even if you don't live in the suburb of Stretton.



To check if you need to vote, scan the QR code and search your address



#### Vote in person

Early voting is from Monday 12 July to Friday 23 July (weekdays only).

Election day is Saturday, 24 July.

#### Postal voting

You have until Monday 12 July to apply for postal vote at: [ecq.qld.gov.au/postalsBE](http://ecq.qld.gov.au/postalsBE)

If you have already applied for a postal vote, complete and return it as soon as you get it. You must complete your vote by 6pm Saturday 24 July, and the ECQ must receive it by 6pm Tuesday 3 August for your vote to be counted.

Remember to put your completed ballot paper in the declaration envelope, sign and have it witnessed. Then put the declaration envelope in the Reply Paid envelope to return to the ECQ.

#### Telephone voting

If you can't postal vote, or attend a polling booth because you are ill or have disability, you might be able to telephone vote. Telephone voting registrations will be open from Monday 12 July to noon on election day, Saturday 24 July.
