People in Herberton who were included in D2 in the last boundary change felt disenfranchised and very much wanted to be included in the current Division 1 - The current Division 1 provides a logical link between Atherton and Herberton based on the highway and tourism infrastructure such as Chinatown and the mountain bike park pushing tourists towards Herberton for outdoor recreation and heritage / cultural interests. - Whilst Herberton community has a good relationship with Ravenshoe community, there is a stronger practical link with Atherton as the major service centre. - The proposed Division 1 has no community of interest and cuts up the transport links. - It would be better if the population could be balanced by Division 2 taking in more of Wondecla, right up to the start of Herberton township and also more of upper Barron, and Wongabel, as the Kennedy Highway is a natural transport link. It makes sens for Division 2 to stretch right down the Kennedy even into Atherton, as Division 2 needs a stronger link with Atherton as the regional centre.
