# INVITATION FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS ON THE OBJECTIONS TO THE PROPOSED STATE ELECTORAL DISTRICTS

The Queensland Redistribution Commission (the *Commission*) commenced its redistribution of the state's electoral districts on Friday, 3 June 2016. A notice was published in the Queensland Government Gazette, advising of the need for a redistribution and naming the three Commissioners:

- Hugh Botting, Chairperson, formerly a judge of the District Court of Queensland;
- Liza Carroll, Member, Director-General, Department of Housing and Public Works;
- Walter van der Merwe, Member, Electoral Commissioner of Queensland.

Public suggestions on the redistribution were then invited for a 30 day period from Saturday, 25 June 2016. Throughout all stages of public consultation, the *Commission* has placed advertisements in more than 40 newspapers circulating around Queensland, including in the Courier Mail and Sunday Mail. Following the closure of suggestions, public comments on those suggestions were invited until Monday, 29 August 2016.

The *Commission* carefully considered current and projected enrolment data, public submissions and where practicable, community of interest concerns in formulating its Proposal for the Redistribution of the State's Electoral Districts.

Upon releasing its proposal on Friday, 24 February 2017, public objections to this document were invited for 30 days until 5pm Monday, 27 March 2017. The objections received during this period are enclosed in this document.

### **General Observations**

The Queensland Parliament passed legislation in 2016 to add an additional four state electorates to the existing 89. While numerous public contributors have expressed opposition to increasing the number of districts, the *Commission* is bound by the legislation and must redistribute the state into 93 electorates.

While formulating the proposal, it became apparent that much more would be required than minor trimming of, and adjustments to, the existing electorates. The information available to the commissioners makes it clear there is a drift in population from the west to the coast, and more especially, to the south-east corner of the State. The predictions are that this trend will continue. The commissioners therefore concluded that the time was appropriate to adopt a robust approach to the redistribution.

As expected, there is considerable public interest in this review. All three invitations for public submissions have resulted in almost twice the numbers of respondents than during the previous redistribution in 2008. The *Commission* received 1546 objections to its proposal. Many of the submissions received were most thoughtful and detailed. The commissioners wish to sincerely thank all of those persons who have taken the time to participate in the public consultation process to date.

#### The Scheme of the Electoral Act 1992

In effecting a redistribution the *Commission* is bound by the various requirements set out in the *Electoral Act 1992* (the *Act*). The most significant of those requirements is that all electorates should contain a similar number of electors.

In determining the electoral boundaries of Queensland's 93 districts, an "average number of enrolled electors" referred to as 'quota' is derived by dividing the total number of electors in the State by 93 (see s. 3.) As at Monday, 29 August 2016 the total number of electors in the State was 3,084,596, and hence the quota is 33,168. The *Act* provides that the number of electors in each electoral district <u>must be within</u> 10% of the quota (s. 45) and hence each electorate must have at least 29,851 and no more than 36,485 electors.

There is one exception to the above requirement. Where an electoral district has an area greater than 100,000 km<sup>2</sup>, a special rule ("additional large district number") applies. That rule is that a notional number of electors is arrived at by adding a number equal to 2% of the district's area to the actual number of electors within the district. The combined total number of electors must be within 10% of the quota (s. 45.)

The requirement that the numbers of electors within each electoral district must be within a 10% tolerance is binding on the *Commission* - the commissioners have no discretion to propose a district which is not within such tolerance.

#### Other Criteria

Subject to overriding district enrolment requirements, the *Act* makes it clear that there are a number of criteria to be considered by the commissioners in determining a redistribution. The *Act* also stipulates that it is a matter for the *Commission* as to what, if any weight, is given to these additional criteria (see s. 46(3), (4), and (5).)

The criteria are set out in section 46 of the Act and can be summarised as follows:

- **a.** The extent to which there is a community of economic, social, regional or other interest within each proposed electoral district;
- **b.** The ways of communication and travel within each proposed electoral district;
- **c.** The physical features of each proposed electoral district;
- **d.** The boundaries of existing electoral districts;
- **e.** Demographic trends in the State, with a view to ensuring as far as practicable that, on the basis of the trends, the need for another electoral redistribution will not arise under section 39 before it does under section 38.

There is a further discretionary guideline:

**f.** The *Commission* may consider the boundaries of local government areas to the extent that it is satisfied that there is a community of economic, social, regional or other interests within each local government area.

The commissioners have in fact taken into account each of the above guidelines in respect of each proposed electoral district. In formulating its proposal the *Commission* has at times given greater or lesser weight to the various guidelines as the exigencies of each electoral district requires.

#### The Remainder of the State Redistribution Process

As soon as practicable following the closing date for comments on the objections, the Commission will make these submissions available for public inspection. As with the objections, copies will be available on the website, at the Commission's office or by alternative arrangement.

After considering the objections and comments, the Commission will gazette its final determination for the names and boundaries of Queensland's 93 electoral districts on Friday, 26 May 2017.

Under section 54 of the Act, the final determination and associated documents will be given to the Honourable the Attorney-General and Minister for Justice and Minister for Training and Skills who must table the documents in Parliament within five sitting days of their receipt.

A notice containing details of the Commission's final determination will be published in the *Queensland Government Gazette*. Following 21 days from the publication of this notice (subject only to an appeal being lodged in the Court of Appeal) the boundaries and names are considered final and are not subject to further appeal. When the writ is issued for the next State General Election, the 93 new electoral districts come into effect. Queensland will then remain redistributed in these districts until the conclusion of the next Queensland state electoral redistribution.

# **Comments on the Draft State Electoral Boundaries**

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the draft redistribution of Queensland's state electoral boundaries. Having made a submission at the 'comments on suggestions' stage, I would like to offer my appreciation of the commissioners work and commend the boundaries contained in the proposal. I would however like to lodge my objection to the naming of state electorates after people. Although this is a novel way of honouring contributions to the state, particularly of women and indigenous people, the electorates chosen for renaming appear to be random. I note that Western Australia recently proposed naming state electorates after prominent figures but reverted to using geographical names in the final determination. This is the convention across Australia for state electoral boundaries, with federal electorates named after prominent figures, which I believe should be upheld here in Queensland. Listed below are my suggestions for electorate names based on geographical features:

- The proposed *Hill* to be renamed *GILLIES*, after the mountain range and highway
- The proposed *Oodgeroo* reverts to its existing name of **CLEVELAND** or takes on **QUANDAMOOKA**
- The proposed new electorate of *Bonney* is named **OLSEN**, after the main road acting as the central spine of the electorate
- The proposed Cooper reverts to its existing name of ASHGROVE or takes on ITHACA
- The proposed new electorate of *Macalister* is named **BEENLEIGH**
- The proposed *McConnel* reverts to its existing name of BRISBANE CENTRAL
- The proposed *McMaster* reverts to the former name of **BURDEKIN** or takes on BOWEN BASIN
- The proposed *Maiwer* takes on either of the former names of INDOOROOPILLY or MOUNT COOT-THA – both these names are derived from Aboriginal words
- The proposed *Miller* reverts to the former name of **YEERONGPILLY**
- The proposed new electorate of *Jordan* is named **GREENBANK**, after the central suburb and military camp
- The proposed *Theodore* should revert to the former name of **ALBERT** to avoid confusion with the town of Theodore in central Queensland (Callide electorate)
- The proposed new electorate of Bancroft is named DECEPTION BAY
- The proposed *Traeger* to be renamed **FLINDERS**, after the highway connecting Cloncurry and Charters Towers

Once again, I would to thank the Commission for the opportunity to contribute to the redistribution process and offer my support to the boundaries proposed, with names reflecting geographical features rather than prominent figures.

Hello, I would like to voice my concerns over the proposed redistribution. In my opinion the people in the major cities are getting too much of a say in our laws, and the people in the bush are not getting enough of a say, particularly in matters that directly affect their entire lives, for example tree clearing, water storage etc. We have a system where the biggest five or six electorates contain a relatively small number of people, and the heavily populated city areas with perhaps similar numbers per electorate get to have about eighty politicians to speak for them. I am aware that there are many of the city electorates that are seen as ALP or LNP strongholds so that those two parties still have to fight it out the win government, but there are also a number of smaller parties that want a say in the running of the state too. The city areas have many electorates where green minded people who have no real idea about farming, fishing, agriculture etc live, and it is highly likely that many of those people live in a few electorates rather than spread evenly over seventy or eighty electorates, this allows green groups to elect their representatives and we may find several Green seats elected because of this, yet if the same logic was applied to a different party, that has the interests of mining, agriculture etc as their main focus, the people most likely to support that party would be spread over those five or six electorates, and they still have to compete with the two major parties, so we may well find a situation where the govt is made up of either ALP, or LNP and supported by a few Green seats, with the interests of the vast majority of the land in the state represented by maybe one or tow others, who will really get no say. The problem with this in my view is that in the case of the Greens, they have anti hunting, anti farming, anti fishing, anti mining and anti lots of things as their main agenda, and these views are largely ideological and emotionally based, and they can influence the govt in decisions about how our national parks are managed, mining applications, how farmers may clear land and so on, and they mostly have no real idea as to what impact their restrictive policies affect the farms and mines and pests in our public land areas. I believe the vast and sparcely populated areas should have a heavier weighting in relation to the numbers of voters, particularly as there is an ongoing population drift from the bush to the city so the numbers are reducing. While a distribution based only on land area would be just as bad as one based only on population areas, I do think the bush needs more members of parliament than less, and in fact I think we should be reducing the number of politicians rather than increasing them. The cost of maintaining and supporting all these politicians is significant ad we should be able to get by with many less, say fifty one.

Calliope has always been closely aligned with Gladstone for government and services. Calliope residents rely on Gladstone for not only employment, but education (other than primary), most medical, optical, podiatry, physiology and dental services, hospital services, most banking, general and specialist shopping, transport and communications, most entertainment and many sports. In return, Calliope township and suburbs provide recreation facilities for Gladstone residents camping and fishing spots, rodeos and campdrafts, venues for other horse and cattle sports, regular market days. Calliope sports teams (football, soccer, cricket etc) are integrated with the Gladstone sports rosters. Calliope residents eat at Gladstone restaurants, and Gladstone people eat at Calliope clubs and play at Calliope Bowls and Golf venues. Calliope residents contribute taxes to help pay for some of these services in our local area. Calliope is also part of the Gladstone Regional Council area at local government levels and share a postcode 4680 with Gladstone. To travel to the Callide electoral centre of Monto means Calliope residents need to travel through Biloela, then from Biloela to Monto as the Monto-Gladstone road is not fully sealed and is not a safe option with steep climbs. Calliope is separated from Monto by a mountain range. 

Dear Commissioners.

As a resident of the proposed new electorate of Hill, I strongly support the proposed boundaries of the new electorate, which re-unites the town of Innisfail (formerly divided between Mulgrave and Hinchinbrook) and links the Atherton Tablelands with the rest of the wet tropics bioregion with which it shares a clear community identity. I applaud everything about Hill, except for its proposed name.

According to its report, the Commission followed specific principles in naming electorates:

The commissioners decided, as a general principle, to adopt indigenous names where appropriate and possible for electoral districts requiring a name or new name.

The view was taken that the names of prominent people who had contributed to the life of the State might, in appropriate cases, be used. Obviously, the person whose name was to be used should, in most cases, have a significant relationship with the electorate.


The Commission decided to move away from the practice of naming electoral districts after towns or suburbs within them, favouring instead the use of significant landmarks.


The naming of Hill does not appear to be particularly consistent with these principles. Professor Dorothy Hill, while clearly an admirable person most deserving of having an electorate named after her, has no connection to this electorate at all. Her entire life and career were spent in Brisbane. Her one tenuous link to our region seems to be that the Great Barrier Reef was a topic of her research, though her only direct connection with it seems to be the research station she founded on Heron Island, approximately 1,000 kilometres south of the electorate proposed to bear her name. I respectfully submit that if the Commission wishes to name an electorate after Professor Hill, they choose the proposed new electorate of Maiwa, in which she lived and worked, or rename Gladstone, the electorate in which Heron Island is located.

Our southern Wet Tropics region may not boast many prominent people who have contributed to the life of the state, but we do most definitely have a significant landmark - the highest mountain in Queensland, Chooreechillum. I submit that this would be a much better choice of name for our new electorate, both more consistent with the Commission's own principles, and more popular with the people of Far North Queensland, who expect a local connection to the names of their electorates. Chooreechillum is visible from most of the populated areas of the new electorate, whether they are located on the Tablelands or the coast, and the choice would have local resonance for the entire electorate.

The mountain's indigenous name is currently not widely known, which is a shame, considering that it is the highest mountain in Queensland. Naming our new electorate Chooreechillum would help immeasurably to promote widespread community knowledge and use of the mountain's original name throughout Queensland. I respectfully ask that the Commission give consideration to this suggestion.

#### Dear commissioners,

I state my objection to the proposal to discard several geographically named districts for districts named for individuals. I also object to naming new electorates for individuals when there are perfectly appropriate geographic names available.

A district named for a locality within it provides a much more recognisable description of the electorate than a more generic name does. The current convention is that state electorates generally have geographic names and federal electorates generally honour significant individuals. Notwithstanding numerous exceptions, I think this convention is a good one and ought to be maintained. Unnecessary chopping and changing of electorate names may also cause voter confusion.

I submit that the proposed districts of Cooper (Ashgrove), McConnel (Brisbane Central), McMaster (Burdekin), Miller (Yeerongpilly), Oodgeroo (Cleveland), Tibrogargan (Glass House) and Toohey (Sunnybank) ought to retain their current names.

Several other districts would also be made more identifiable with geographic names:

- Bancroft would be better named Deception Bay or North Lakes.
- Bonney would be better named Labrador.
- Hill would be better named Tablelands.
- Jordan would be better named Springfield.
- Macalister would be better named Beenleigh.
- Maiwar would be better named Toowong. Equally it could retain either the name Indooroopilly or Mount Coot-tha. However Toowong seems more appropriate; the new district draws roughly equally from both former districts and leaves out large parts of both.
- Theodore would be better named Oxenford (since Albert has been rendered unsuitable).

The new names of D'Aguilar (Pine Rivers) and Scenic Rim (Beaudesert) both make sense. But equally both districts could retain their current names for the sake of continuity.

I will acknowledge Traegar as a worthy exception; the district is now so large that the name Mount Isa is no longer appropriate.



Please retain this submission as a formal submission to the commission rather than Website QC.

Submission summary: The current information communicated to the public fails to communicate electorate/electoral boundary *changes* in the majority of cases. Rather they present new boundary maps containing no reference against which to assess change(s). This constitutes a serious QRC communications and management oversight failure. My submission requests an extension of the comments period until this is rectified, and introduction of associated EQC-QRC quality assurance processes to prevent such oversight in future.

#### Associated narrative

My submission is that the maps are an indicator of an inability of EQC via QRC coherently and effectively communicate the electorate *changes* themselves. Change assessment by stakeholders *de facto* requires a reference against which change is assessed. The current communications (specifically maps) lack this fundamental aspect. And that lack of clear, easily available reference has substantially negatively impacted the ability of electorate voter stakeholders to assess *changes* to their electorates, rather what the new boundaries are.

The commission's responsibilities and duty-of-care specifically include communication of electoral boundary/electorate changes. In this instance it appears not a single commission member asked themselves whether their principal communication method (the map) actually communicated the *change*, rather than simply presenting new proposed boundaries. Did EQC-QRC assume the majority of those they were communicating with committed their existing electorate boundaries to memory? Or would take the extra step to look up the old maps (not straightforward)?

That is a serious oversight which goes to the effectiveness of commission operations overall. As oversights such as this reflect poor quality system and stakeholder communications practices more generally.

I emphasise that this is an issue that for the vast majority of electorates changes (via the published maps) would have been solved literally by a single mouse-click data-layer selection. Indeed, the necessary "existing" layer itself would have specifically have to have been removed. An extraordinary oversight.

Dear Chairperson Botting, In relation to the Electoral District of Townsville, I found the commission's proposal to be slightly confusing. When looking at the maps provided, it suggests that there will be a slight alteration to the electorate, yet the wording of the report (relating to the Electoral District of Townsville) itself suggested that no alteration is necessary. While I understand that it is the wording (and not the maps) that stand at the end of the day, I would still like to make a submission, especially given that I lack the adequate clarification at hand to distinguish the difference between the map provided, and the wording of the report. The map suggests that the entirety of the Great Palm Islands group (and along with that, the Palm Island Aboriginal Council LGA, and community of Palm Island itself) will be moved into the Electoral District of Hinchinbrook. Whilst I understand that with the establishment of four extra seats in our state's south-east will ultimately dilute the representation of North Queenslanders in the legislative assembly more broadly, I personally believe that moving Palm Island into Hinchinbrook will be significantly detrimental to that particular community. Despite being marginally closer to the Hinchinbrook Electorate office (46km away), than the Townsville Electorate office (57km away), historically the community of Palm Island has maintained very close links with the Townsville community. Even to this day, all scheduled flights from Palm Island depart and arrive in Townsville Airport (located in the Townsville electorate), and with exception to the infrequent barge service to Lucinda, the regular ferry service also departs and arrives within the Townsville electorate. Palm Islanders heavily rely on the City of Townsville for the goods and services that the city provides. Unlike surrounding communities (such as Ingham, Charters Towers, and the Burdekin), Palm Island also lacks certain amenities which many of those communities have available, particularly retail offerings, specialist health services, and choice in education institutions. In addition to that, a number of public sector organisations which assist the community (like the Palm Island Community Company for example) are based in Townsville, and the inclusion of Palm Island into Hinchinbrook would also provide an inconsistency with the community's representation at a Federal level (being in the Division of Herbert which also encompasses most of urban Townsville). Between 2003 and 2011, figures provided by the Queensland Government Statistician's Office shows that the community has also experienced negative population growth, and whilst positive population growth is projected to have happened in the period between 2011 and 2016, it is expected that growth will average 1.4% (approx 150 people). While I acknowledge that the wording of the report indicated that Palm Island will likely not be removed from the Electoral District of Townsville, I felt compelled to write this submission in the event that the community's removal is even being remotely considered (as the map of Hinchinbrook would suggest). I also acknowledge that I write this submission as an individual, and without consultation of members of the Palm Island community, and that submissions by members of the Palm Island community into the review of electoral boundaries relating to either Hinchinbrook or Townsville should take greater precedent over my submission. Dear Sir/Madam

I appreciate the opportunity to comment on the Queensland Redistribution Commission's published draft proposals to alter the boundaries of electoral divisions throughout Queensland to allow for a more even distribution of voters responsible for electing MPs representing those seats and to allow for an increase in the overall number of seats in the Legislative Assembly, from 89 to 93.

Specifically, I wish to focus on the proposed boundary changes as they relate to the divisions of Gympie, Noosa and Nicklin around where the boundaries intersect in the Noosa Hinterland.

In undertaking its task, the Commission has proposed to:

- remove Rainbow Beach from the Gympie Division to the Noosa Division
- excise Pomona from the Gympie Division and place it with nearby Cooroy, within the Nicklin Division
- excise the communities of Kin Kin and Cooran from Gympie and place them within the Noosa Division.

The Commission is likely to receive strong representation from the community at Rainbow Beach, protesting at the removal of that locality from the Gympie Division. Rainbow Beach has very little affinity with Noosa and a strong economic and social link with Gympie City. Furthermore, Rainbow Beach shares a 'community of interest' with Cooloola Cove and Tin Can Bay. All three localities should remain together in the Gympie Division, I submit.

Likewise, the communities of Kin Kin, Boreen Point, Cooran, Federal and Pomona have been a single community of interest since the early days of European settlement. Pomona was the original headquarters town of Noosa Shire Council and all the towns are within Noosa Shire. Pomona is the service centre for the other communities – having the major supermarket, only bank and petrol stations for the northern Noosa Hinterland. The Noosa Country Show, held at Pomona since 1911 is the focus of rural enterprise for the entire area. The Pomona Police District covers Kin Kin, Cooran and Federal. Pomona has a working courthouse and its jurisdiction covers these other towns also. Pomona children attend the Federal State School, students attending the Junior Campus of the Noosa District High School are bussed in from places such as Cooran and Kin Kin. It is easy to see that any referral to the local member (the Member for Noosa) regarding a school matter would need to be referred to the Member for Nicklin, and so on.

With a clear social, economic and administrative inter-connection established among these various towns, the Commission wishes to split off Pomona to attach it to an electoral division based on Nambour.

I request that the Commission re-consider its decision and, once more, place Pomona and its surrounds, such as Stratford Park, within the same electoral division as its satellite communities, namely the Division of Noosa.

The solution, therefore, becomes:

- reinstate Rainbow Beach (within the Gympie Regional Council area) to the Division of Gympie and away from the Division of Noosa and, to compensate
- attach Pomona and surrounds, together with the communities of Federal, Kin Kin,
   Cooran and Boreen Point within the boundaries of the Division of Noosa.

Such action would be appropriate, as the Division of Noosa would share a common boundary with the shire of the same name in coastal communities. Within the Noosa Hinterland, there would be more definitive dividing alignments, such as Yurol Forest and Forest Acres Drive. The edge of Yurol Forest and parts of Forest Acres Drive, Ringtail Creek Road and McKinnon Drive become an obvious dividing line between the divisions of Nicklin and Noosa.

Across the Bruce Highway, Federal (but not Tuchekoi) and rural residential blocks around Middle Creek Road, Northmount Road, Blankesee Road and a portion of Black Mountain Range Road (connecting to the Old Bruce Highway) would fall within the Division of Noosa under this scenario, not Nicklin.

Bringing additional population within the Division of Noosa would not alter quota margins. The commission estimates that the Noosa Division will be 6.24 per cent <u>below</u> quota in 2023. Bringing Pomona and its satellite communities within the Noosa boundary means the quota is unlikely to be exceeded for Noosa during the next ten years.

I urge the Commission to reconsider the boundaries between the Divisions of Gympie, Nicklin and Noosa along the lines of the suggestions above (bearing in mind that Noosa Shire has a 'population cap' of approximately 65,000).

As the Federal Member of Blair I represent the area covered by the State electorate of Ipswich West and part of the growing community of Springfield in the city of Ipswich.

Let me commend the ECQ for its decision to create a new Ipswich based seat on Springfield and its surrounds. The decision to name an Ipswich based seat *Jordan* after one of Ipswich's most distinguished daughters is most welcome.

Vi Jordan was a long term resident of Brassall – the most populated suburb in Ipswich West. She represented Brassall and its adjoining areas in the Ipswich City Council and then in the Queensland Parliament as a Member of the Legislative Assembly representing Ipswich West.

For many years the electorate office of the Member for Ipswich West has been located in the Brassall Shopping Centre in Hunter Street.

The name *Ipswich West* has been a curious choice for a seat which could just as easily be called *Ipswich North*. Most of the constituents of Ipswich West reside north of the Bremer River in the suburbs of Brassall, North Ipswich, Tivoli, Karalee and others. The recent draft redistribution results in Ipswich West clearly being the most northerly of the Ipswich electorates.

My suggestion is the seat of *Ipswich West* be renamed *Jordan*. This would be more appropriate given Vi Jordan's historic political contribution and the anomalous naming of Ipswich West.

If the ECQ accepts this suggestion, then I'd ask that the new Ipswich seat be named *Springfield*. This name would be appropriate given the significance of Springfield Central and its surrounding suburbs (including Springfield Lakes) to the newly created seat.

Secondly, based on projected population growth, it is highly likely the next state redistribution will see the Logan parts of the new seat and possibly even Camira, Gailes and Carole Park excised from the seat. The ECQ could avoid any need to rename the new seat during future redistributions by now naming it *Springfield*.


My submission refers to the boundary of the currently named electorates of Murrumba, Kallangur & Morayfield (proposal refers to them as Bancroft, Murrumba and Kurwongbah).

I do not agree with the left boundary line that sees the Bancroft border stop following the Bruce Highway when it reaches Deception Bay Road and suddenly start following Old Gympie Road until Fresh Water Creek in Kallangur.

The border should continue following the Bruce Highway the whole way (just like it is currently in the existing distribution). See picture below — the blue line shows where the boundary should follow. The highway serves as a natural and simple boundary for the existing suburbs so why would the electorate boundary not follow along it.


There is absolutely no logical reason to split so many suburbs – the areas cut are largely industrial/commercial so it is unlikely there will ever be an increase in population – however those areas will not be fairly represented if lumped in with the satellite city of North Lakes. It makes far more sense for the whole suburbs of Narangba and Burpengary to be inside the Kurwongbah boundary and the whole suburbs of Dakabin and Kallangur be inside the Murrumba boundary.

Dakabin and Kallangur especially already struggle to get their fair share of attention and funding and this split will only encourage further neglect.

### **OBJECTION TO PINE RIVERS ELECTORATE NAME CHANGE**

To whom it may concern

As a resident of Pine Rivers I wish to make an objection of the name change of Pine Rivers to D'Aguilar.

Firstly it is important to keep the name as it has a long history. The first township in the area that was established was North Pine (now Petrie) in 1868. The areas of flat land around Brendale and Strathpine were used as airfields during the Second World War and the areas from Kremzow Road in Warner to the North Pine River at Youngs Crossing then North East across Dayboro Road into where Frenchs Forest Estate is now. Figure 1 is a picture of the Strathpine airstrip (now Spitfire Avenue) and Figure 2 is from Camp Strathpine.

Secondly the urban part around Warner, Bray Park, Strathpine and Brendale which has a majority of the proposed electorate's population (see figure 3) is nowhere near the D'Aguilar Range. So why name an electorate after a mountain range that a majority of the population are nowhere near.

Thirdly is that the areas that are in the D'Aguilar Range are also in the Pine Rivers Catchment. By keeping the name Pine Rivers it is also relevant to the people in the rural areas. Figure 4 shows the proposed electorate boundaries compared to the Pine River Catchment boundaries. There is a tiny part of the electorate in the south that has very few electors that is not in the Pine River catchment

Finally when people in the area are asked where do they live many say they live in Pine Rivers. There are also places in the area that use the name Pine Rivers because that is the area that we live. Figure 5 are photos of some places with Pine Rivers in their name.

In 2008 the area was disappointed with the amalgamation with the Shire of Caboolture and the City of Redcliffe to form the Moreton Bay Region. Then in 2009 many people were relieved when the electorate of Kurwongbah was renamed Pine Rivers. This disappointment will likely comeback and history will be forgotten if the name is changed.

Thank you for taking the time to read and consider my objection to the name change.

Dear Commissioners,

I wish to lodge an abjection with the boundaries commission. I had earlier made a submission and commented on submissions.

There are some errors in the draft report and maps. I have described those I have found below. At the time of writing I am overseas and may have missed some other apparent errors.

## **Descriptions and Maps**

The narrative for Hinchinbrook and Townsville is inconsistent with the map of both electorates. The narrative implies no change to boundaries of the existing Townsville but the map implies that Palm Island is transferred to Hinchinbrook.

The narrative for Redcliffe suggests no enrollment change despite a boundary change which suggests some electors must have been moved.

## **General comments**

The variation in elector numbers between electorates appears reasonable, the use of local government and major natural and man made features and locality boundaries is quite sound. Based on the analysis of Antony Green the Commissioners also appear to have produced an electorally fair outcome (which whilst not a relevant consideration) is not an unimportant consequence of electoral boundaries redistributions

I live in Aroona in the electorate of Kawana. With the proposed new boundaries I remain in Kawana but see that much of what is regarded by local residents as Kawana moves to Buderim. I find this very strange and wish to raise an objection to the change as I feel there are a great many drawbacks to the proposed boundary. I shop at Kawana Shopping World, I eat at the Kawana Waters Tavern and the Kawana Surf Club, and I have been to meetings, seminars and training at the Kawana Library. I now find all these KAWANA entities will be in Buderim. In addition there are numerous clubs and associations with the word Kawana in their title who meet in what is regarded by us all as Kawana but who will not be in the Kawana electorate but will instead find themselves in Buderim. Buderim is the place up the hill. There is absolutely no connection whatsoever between Buderim and Kawana in either a community, organizational or residential sense. Buderim has "Buderim on Top" - in Kawana we are near and on the coast and not up the hill. Those people who I know who reside the section of Kawana that would be transferred to Buderim regard themselves as Kawana residents – they would never in their wildest dreams think of themselves as Buderim residents. Kawana residents don't shop in Buderim or go to Buderim for a meal or an evening out. There is not social or community connection between the north part of the current Kawana electorate and Buderim. There is however a connection between the part of Kawana that would be transferred to Buderim and the remaining part of Kawana with many residents of the southern part of Kawana shopping, socializing and belonging to various community groups located in the northern section of Kawana. Once the state election is called and if the proposed boundaries are approved Kawana residents will start to receive material from Buderim candidates which will cause no end of confusion. Come polling day when those who have very little interest in boundaries or politics but know they live in Kawana near the Kawana Library, Kawana Surf Club or Kawana Waters Tavern turn up to vote even more confusion will abound. You could live in the apartments virtually next door to the Kawana Waters Tavern, be able to walk to Kawana Shopping World and walk to the Kawana library and then be told you have to vote for a candidate in Buderim and not for a candidate in Kawana. The following represents my thoughts on the recent distribution,

It was reported that population changes were the driver for the proposed alterations, as well as taking into account existing local boundaries.

The permanent population of Rainbow Beach, on the Cooloola Coast, is circa 1000, has been for the past 20 years and by virtue of the geographical surrounds, combined with native title, will remain the same for many, many years to come. If there is to be any substantial growth in population in the foreseeable future, it would be in areas closer to Noosa/Tewantin, so it beggars belief that this decision was reached by a logical process. Is there a hidden agenda behind such an irrational decision?

The map depicting the proposed boundary changes, outlines a remote area of forest and national park stretching some 60 to 70 kilometres north from Lake Cootharaba to the township of Rainbow Beach, so my concern is that I now have lost contact with my immediate surrounds and no longer have local representation.

I personally have no connection or interest with the Sunshine Coast, as would be the case with most locals and I am sure the feeling would be mutual for Noosa people. If someone in the future needs to travel from Rainbow Beach to Noosa, they will have to go through Gympie the logical centre, travel an additional 120 to 140 kilometres and allow for an extra 2 hours travelling time. I have no idea what the situation would be for anyone having to use public transport; could it be completed in one day?

One would assume that the Electoral Commission of Queensland, when making it's rulings would consider the ramifications of such decisions. I would have thought that these conclusions would be in the best interests of the residents of the affected areas. The Electoral Commission has ignored it's own guide lines and plucked a remote township, with a static population, 60 kilometres away, with no infrastructure in between and placed it under the control of an electorate of the heavily populated Sunshine Coast. Furthermore, I would assume that the Commission would be taking decisions for the betterment of all electorates and to stimulate interest with the voters.

To that extent, I would point out that I have been a willing voter for 50 plus years but now feel that for the first time, as a result of these new rulings, I will enter the booth at the next election, with the intention of voting informal. I would add that this is the sentiment of a lot of locals.

In conclusion, it is a brickbat to the Electoral Commission of Queensland for letting itself and a lot of important voters down.

Some boundaries can be a bit awkward on community-of-interest grounds, but usually quota requirements force things. I'm a resident of the Ferny Grove electorate. While I believe the current electorate is a good one, I can also see the merit in the new one. Hopefully the next redistribution will put the Mitchelton-area boundary along Kedron Brook rather than the railway. Presently, that would likely put Everton unacceptably low. I have a minor objection to part of the D'Aguilar and Ferny Grove boundary, and a recommended fix. The suburb of Camp Mountain clearly belongs in D'Aguilar with the rest of Samford. The relevant SA1s are 3138707, 3138710, 3138711, 3138724 (and also the uninhabited part of 3138715 between Bygotts and Samford Rds). The population impact is 976 (current) and 1031 (projected 2022) enrolments, which leaves both electorates within both current and projected tolerances. I also have a comment on the report file as released. The bulk of the file appears to have been scanned in from paper. This is deeply weird. Not only does it make the in-document maps prohibitively lowresolution, it renders the vast bulk of the text unsearchable by electronic means -- and indeed rather awkward to read with all the artifacts from the scanning. What on earth has happened?

**Ref A,** The Redlands City Bulletin, reported that Redlands has a new electorate name under the state redistribution announced today, with the constituency of Cleveland to be renamed Oodgeroo.

It has been proposed to rename the seat after Oodgeroo Noonuccal (aka. Cath Walker) the renowned North Stradbroke Island poet.

Ref B. The book Red over Black – Behind the Aboriginal Land Rights by Geoff McDonald "... is the chilling and almost unbelievable story of the Marxist manipulation of the Aboriginal 'Land Rights' movement, told by a man who learned of Communist strategy while in the Communist Party."

The work of Oodgeroo Noonuccal the poet is widely known. What is not so well known is the flip side of the person, the work of Cath Walker, member of the Australian Communist Party.

The Commonwealth Threat Assessment Paper of 1981 found; Australia's future as a free Western nation was seriously threatened by two movements: one to use the Aboriginal Land Rights issue to eventually establish a separate Aboriginal Nation under communist domination; and the second to fragment an homogeneous and stable Australia by a breaking down of the traditional immigration policy, and by the deliberate fostering of multiculturalism which could only end in the Balkanisation of Australia.

Oodgeroo (Kath Walker) chose to become a member of the Australian Communist Party in the early 1960s when faced with the inadequacy of the established political parties, in particular their failure to address Aboriginal issues and rights. In 1961 she took a position as secretary of the Queensland State Council for the Advancement of Aboriginals and Torres Strait Islanders, and served in that post until 1970. The goal of this group, according to the Encyclopaedia of Women Social Reformers, was to work "toward the integration rather than the assimilation of Aboriginals and [toward] improvements to their civil and political status." (Note: "Integration" and "assimilation" are synonymous???)

# Encyclopaedia of World Biography

Cath Walker studied at the "secret" communist training school at Minto, NSW and associated with other well know communists at the time.

"Social Alternative" was a Marxist periodical produced for use by school teachers and others who held sway over the education of minors. Contributing editors were Dennis Altman then of the University of Sydney, strongly anti-British and supporter of multi-racialism; Gary Foley then on the Government payroll where he used his time, without obstruction, to work towards the establishment of black republics. Others who contributed to the publication were: Bill Hartley of the socialist left and representative of the Libyan Government in Australia; Naomi Myers member of the Black Power movement; Jean McKillop of the socialist left and prominent opponent of the Vietnam War; Kath Walker, one of the most highly trained of the Communist aboriginal operatives (my emphasis); Sam Watson jnr. of the Aboriginal and Islanders Health Service in Queensland; Ted Wheelwright Marxist economist then with the University of Sydney and Jack Munday of the Communist Party of Australia.

# Red over Black P30

The Redland City Bulletin reported that the Redistribution Commission consulted with Quandamooka Yoolooburrabee Aboriginal Corporation (QYAC) and obtained its support before announcing the intention to rename the electorate of Cleveland Oodgeroo. QYAC is the Native Title Body Corporate manager on North Stradbroke. Basically, it is a commercial organisation. The Minjerribah Moorgumpin Elders-in-Council Aboriginal Corporation are the traditional keepers of Aboriginal customs, language and culture. Did The Commission consult with them also? If not, why not?

It is unconscionable to even consider honouring the memory of one whose goal was to divide Australia into two nations – one black and one white. That is beyond the bounds of reason.

Oodgeroo/Cath Walker's legacy is not deserving of the proposed honour. As such I wish to lodge a protest against the proposal to rename the Cleveland Electorate Oodgeroo.

### McKinlay versus Traeger

Dear Sir,

I am writing in relation to the name and boundary changes made to the State Government seat of Dalrymple. This seat has changed its name and its boundaries more times in the past few years then we've had cyclone in the north to bring us some drought saving rains. Most of us up here have been fighting the politicians and the weather, probably not in that order, for as long as I can remember.

We build up our cattle herds with a couple of good years and every southern politician thinks we're suddenly millionaires. I learnt to ride a pony nearly as soon as I was born, way back in the 1940's and I've only just given the game away. Not only do the cattle man and the farmer have to put up with the droughts, he has also to put up with the floods. Dirt farmers have to suffer the likes of Woolworths, the likes of poor roads. Live stock farmers have to suffer the costs of fuel, the tyranny of distance, the lack of support from southern politicians, the costs of freight on everything he wants to sell and everything that is needed to repair whatever it is he has to repair. And repairs are vital, necessary and costly. You can say that those costs are tax-deductible, and so they are but, when those costs are paid out, the grocery bill paid, the freight, the fuel, the electricity, and the kids education all the farmer has left is a 'way of living'. And I can assure you the 'way of living' has deteriorated a lot during my time in the bush.

With better education the generations coming on aren't going to live like their forefathers.

What I am really on about with this epistle is the interfering politicians and the so called 'public servants'.

A classic example is the stretching of electoral boundaries, the manipulation of the rules by politicians, and the mistaken belief that all men are equal. It is an understanding today, by bureaucrats, that everyone should have a computer, everyone should have a university degree, that all working men should work for five days a week and have two days sitting on him bum, or swimming on the beach.

This change of name for the State seat of Dalrymple is a fraud, it's to hoodwink the voter, and most voters couldn't give stuff about the change of name. Why change it and why make the electorate larger? All that emphases is the reduction of voters in these rural electorates, as the younger generations leave these rural areas. All that will achieve is leave these rural areas more isolated.

And where do you people, the people who come up with all these weird and wonderful suggestions live? In air conditioned offices in the cities!

I'll just give you a few facts. It has been suggested the seat of Dalrymple be renamed Traeger. Dalrymple was a politician. When a headstone was erected on Dalrymple's grave in Somerset in

England I personally was responsible for the word 'politician' appearing on his headstone. It had been suggested that the word 'statesman' should appear, that word doesn't. Dalrymple has his name on everything in North Queensland. On lakes, on rivers, on mountains, on roads, on hotels; you name it and Dalrymple has his name attached to it somewhere. Until political interference some years ago the most progressive shire in North Queensland was named Dalrymple, after George Elphinstone Dalrymple. We even have Lake Elphinstone west of Mackay. Dalrymple is a great and well remembered name in North Queensland.

Now, with one stroke of a felt pen, in one instance, his name is wiped off the map, and the name Traeger suggested instead. I do not approve of the removal of his name in this instance, and I disapprove of your suggested name of Traeger, and I'll state my reasons.

I will suggest an alternative name and one much more appropriate to North Queensland.

Alfred Traeger did a great job with the task given to him by the Rev. John Flynn, and I could not fault him on that account. I can remember the first transceiver in use at Lolworth Station in the early days, the operator sat at a chair with the peddle generator at his feet, peddling, while his message was being sent to the reception base in Cloncurry.

Alfred Traeger, OBE, was born in Victoria on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 1895 and died in South Australia on 31<sup>st</sup> July 1980. To the best of my knowledge he was probably never in the State of Queensland. The Rev. Flynn did take him to Alice Springs on at least one occasion to trial his transceivers and I understand he has a Memorial Park in the Alice dedicated to his memory. His contribution to Flynn of the Inland, and to the Royal Flying Doctor Service, is well known and well documented.

I would like to nominate, from the floor, the surname of John McKinlay.

John **McKinlay** was born in Scotland on 26<sup>th</sup> August 1819, he migrated the New South Wales during 1836, he was six feet four inches tall, and came to be an excellent bushman and leader of men. He was on the wharf at Townsville when he learnt he had been chosen to lead the South Australian Government Relief Expedition search for Burke and Wills. While leading this party he found, on 7<sup>th</sup> December 1861, a tree marked by Hewitt indicating the burial place of Burke and that the search for Burke and Wills was over and only King had survived.

McKinley's instructions then were to proceed further north in search of pastoral country and to continue to the Gulf of Carpentaria where he could resupply his party from the HMVS Victoria and return to Adelaide. Unfortunately in February 1862 **McKinlay** met with torrential rain in Sturt's Stony Desert and his party became bogged down for a period. On 20<sup>th</sup> May he reached the area but never did make it to the mouth of the Albert River because he could not penetrate the mangroves.

Being low on provisions and certainly not enough to allow him to return to Adelaide he and his party had only one alternative, to head east to Leichhardt's Burdekin River and follow that river south to the new settlement at Port Denison, Bowen, established by Dalrymple in 1861.

Like A C Gregory before him he headed east, and like Gregory McKinlay met the Burdekin River in the vicinity of today's town of Greenvale. McKinlay found cattle tracks about where the town of Dalrymple was to be surveyed in 1864 but had to trek on south to be met by cattle and two carers west of Bowen and was escorted to Bowen in July 1862. By that time his party had eaten most of the camels. The last camel to knock up was left, exhausted, on the edge of Choppin's Lagoon south of Greenvale. The bones of that camel were later found on the banks of an eastern tributary to the Burdekin River. Today that creek is known as Camel Creek.

In south western Queensland on Carrawilla Station there is a tree marked by **McKinlay.** There is another marked tree near the mid-western town of **McKinlay,** and the town itself is named for him.

I am sure that McKinlay spent more time in Queensland than Traeger did.

I trust your committee will give my suggested name for this electorate some serious consideration.

# MINUTES OF THE WAG GENERAL MEETING 27th February 2017



# 7.00 pm Open Meeting

- 1. Welcome Address George Hatchman (Pres.) George welcomed everyone to the first meeting of the year and acknowledged all invited guests including MP Ian Rickuss, Cr David Pahlke, MP Jon Krause and Chief of Operating Officer for ICC Works, Parks & Recreation Mr Craig Maudsley with Sport and Recreation Officer Bryce Hines. George thanked the Girl Guides for making the facilities available and providing tea and super. Thank you to Ti Tree for providing financial assistance for hiring costs. Safety procedures and toilet location was read out.
- 2. Attendance Record & Apologies . Attendance as per sheet. Apologies: Mayor Paul Pisasale, Shane Newman MP, Bo-Erik Holmvquist TI Tree, Michael Tran Willowbank Business Rep, Chad Hayes, Kathy & Ray Browning, Peter & Kath Groenenberg and Glenys Ashton.
- 3. Presentation on the proposed developments at Willowbank Raceway Mr, Craig Maudsley Chief Operating Officer ICC Works, Parks & Recreation.

  Mr Craig Maudsley; Chief Operating Officer ICC Works, Parks & Recreation gave a presentation on the proposed development of the Ipswich Motorsport Precinct at the Willowbank Raceway on behalf of the Ipswich Mayor Paul Pisasale. Communication/marketing brochures of the master plan development were handed out for residents to view. Craig introduced himself and Bryce Hines (Sport and Recreational Officer) and their roles before explaining the aims and intentions of the motor sport development.

The aim of this development is to bring future long term economic benefit the Ipswich region. Ipswich Motor Sport Park Pty Ltd is a single share holding company with a long term master plan of providing a world class motor sport precinct to Ipswich. This will also allow the hosting of large music festival events like CMC Rock (3 yrs running), bringing 15,000 people and economic opportunities to Ipswich.

The proposed \$200 million upgrades of the track and infrastructure are set to provide an industrial network supporting a range of motor sport and general automotive related business. This will to deliver economic development off the back of the sport as well as supporting other related companies like Queensland Raceway, Willowbank Raceway and the Ipswich Car Club. Craig explained that the investment that this sport can bring to our city is huge as motor sport is not only the most watched sport event in Australia but it is also popular in countries across the world, bringing major investment opportunities to Ipswich. Craig also raised the issue of Buffer zones specific to the precinct for residential and industrial business area, but these will be the subject of later discussions.

In the subsequent Q & A session, the following concerns were raised by Willowbank Area residents

**Cunningham Highway**. It was noted there was no acknowledgement in the proposed development of the significant additional adverse impact this project will have on an already overburdened Cunningham Highway. The WAG requested such an acknowledgement be incorporated into public material about the project.

**Community Consultation**. Residents raised the lack of community consultation about a development of this size in our backyard, and the possible impact it might have on the amenity of Willowbank residents. Residents requested they be permitted to have input about the wider impact of the project to ensure the maintenance of good neighbor relations with the raceway.

**Koala Protection.** IKPS sought advice on the management of what is the largest koala habitat in the region, and input to those management plans.

**Rural Fire Brigade Operations**. MT Forbes RFB raised their concerns about road access and water supply on the west side of the raceway.

In response to these matters Craig noted that the ICC had no role in the upgrade of the Cunningham Highway other than to continue to lobby the responsible Federal and State Govt bodies. He said he would take our requests for input to the development and closer consultation back to the project Board for their consideration.

With regard to the Koala situation he noted that no additional land will be used for the project and the existing koala management plans would be maintained. Again, he would advise the Board of the resident's concerns about local wildlife.

He noted that the RFB concerns are real and they will examine possible the extension of existing "no through roads" to enable access.

In response to general questions about access to the raceway, Craig discussed several existing and possible future options about getting to the raceway, such as bus and rail transport, but did acknowledge that in a perfect world, the Highway upgrade with grade separated exits would be the answer.

In thanking Craig and Bryce for their attendance and candor, WAG President George noted that the Willowbank Community was generally receptive and supportive of the race track development and the concomitant economic benefits to our region. However, he reiterated our concerns about consultation and the adverse impact the development will have on the Cunningham Highway traffic load. Craig assured the meeting that those concerns will be raised with the project Board and offered to return to the following WAG meetings to keep residents up to date on progress.

The visitors departed and the normal meeting resumed.

Lights Competition. Rose, Amberley Girl Guides leader, thanked WAG for the opportunity, mentioning the girls and their families had a lively night. She also apologized for missing the Palm Meadows Home Village in the Christmas Light Competition and explained that next year they'll be visiting and singing carols for the village.

- **b.** WAG 2016 Community Grants Ian Dainer (V.Pres.) Ian presented winners with their cheque award and explained why they were chosen and what they will be using the money towards.
- Amberley Girl Guides New facilities
- Mt Forbes Rural Fire Brigade Signage to update community on fire
- Rosewood District Support Centre Men Shed program
- Ruth from Koala Hospital (with Serin the koala) Hospital care
- Joyce & Peter from Rosewood Uniting Church providing pastoral care
- Ipswich PCYC Purchasing a car for the Breaking the Cycle program

  Ipswich PCYC are also looking for volunteer mentor drivers to help young

  people achieve their 100 hours of accompanied driving practice. Details to be

- c. Coopers Ridge Park improvements George Hatchman (Pres.) George noted that with the help of Cr David Pahlke, the park has been informally named Mack Park after a pioneering family who owned the land. George and Lauren met on site with ICC's Open Space Panning to scope out plans for habitat regeneration, walking tracks, viewing platforms and playgrounds. Together we have agreed on a footpath loop (worth \$4-5,000) from Shannon Court to Waterford Place around the perimeter of the Mack Park. This pathway will provide access to scenic viewpoints of Ipswich, Springfield, the Scenic Rim and on a clear day; NSW.

Originally the WAG Committee had planned to establish a viewing platform with ICC plans to take advantage of the 270 degree vista, however, after meeting with ICC it was realized that this development would not be practically or economically viable once wheelchair accessibility is taken into account (for every 1m high, 20m's worth of ramp is required under Australian Standards). Alternatively, a scenic viewpoint connected to the footpath facing the Scenic Rim has been selected for a seating viewpoint. ICC also plans to eventually install a small playground on the Shannon Court entry to the park. At the present stage, concept plans have gone back to council to be deliberated.

Some residents presented concerns for neighboring property's privacy, car parking and the children's playground being too close to wildlife, particularly large male kangaroos. Tree selection will be planned with consideration of neighboring properties to rebuild koala habitat. Residents will be invited when the time comes, to participate in tree planting and monitoring programs. Residents are encouraged to walk through the Nature Reserve and Mack Park and give feedback where necessary. It is hoped that these developments will provide a community space for locals to exercise, observe wildlife in their natural habitat and to see the hidden away landscapes across Ipswich and the Scenic Rim.

d. Heit Park B-B-Q facility and Jr. BMX Bike Track - Cr. David Pahlke Cr David Pahlke spoke about the proposed BMX Track and BBQ installments referring to design handouts. The WAG Committee agreed to share the funding with ICC and Cr Pahlke anticipated construction to start later this calendar year. Ian gave a brief on how our WAG grant funds work. He then moved a motion proposing the WAG utilize grants funds to pay 50% of the total costs for the Mini BMX Track and BBQ. Motion seconded by Suzy Smith Carried







- e. Vehicle Blocking Bollards around Heit Park. Residents requested Council fund bollards around Heit Park to prevent hooning cars entering the park at night. After some discussion, Cr David Pahlke agreed to make enquires regarding costs.
- f. Cunningham Hwy upgrade Ian Dainer (V.Pres.) & MP Ian Rickuss. The Cunningham Highway upgrade is still being strongly pushed by all levels of government. The current measure shows 7,000 cars are travelling through the Willowbank intersection a day compared to 17,000 cars a day travelling through Amberley. This shows the intensity of traffic travelling through to RAAF Base Amberley on a daily basis. Although these numbers are less than what would normally be considered a 'priority', it has been put on the Infrastructure Australia Priority List due to the industry aspects associated with the RAAF Base and Willowbank Raceway and other local businesses. Chris Ninness advised the meeting that at present there are 7000 personal working on RAAF Base Amberley, expected to rise to 12,000 in 3 to 4 years.
- **g. Highway Access Visibility**. Adelis Bauer sought advice from Ian Rickuss MP about getting trees, which are obstructing visibility at Anderson Rd entry to the Cunningham Highway, cut down. Ian will follow up.
- h. Current Work on The Highway. Minor works will be ongoing along the Amberley flats in coming weeks and delays should be expected. Residents also thanked Cr David for attending to the steel mesh fence on the highway parallel to Heit Street.
- 7. **Treasurer's Report** In the absence of Treasurer Terry, President George advised the following balances:

WAG Community Grants Fund (Held by ICC in trust) \$130,000 Admin Account \$2,887 balance at 31<sup>st</sup> January 2017

8. MLA Lockyer's Report - MP Ian Rickuss. Ian Rickuss, Member for Lockyer touched on the highway upgrade with news that the giant round-about proposal is a no go. New boundaries for State Electorates were recently released where Willowbank will now belong to the Scenic Rim while Rosewood belongs to Ipswich West. This decision can be objected to within a 30 day period from the QEC Website, however each electorate must cover 30,000 people so it unlikely that boundaries will change. MP Ian Rickuss then introduced new Member for Beaudesert Jon Krause who gave a short introduction to his background in the Scenic Rim. George thanked both members for attending and for their contribution to the region.

**Note:** During general discussions, George advocated that Willowbank should have been relocated to the electorate of Ipswich West, our community of interest. This was generally endorsed by the meeting attendees.

9. ICC Div.10 Councilor's Report - Cr. David Pahlke Cr David Pahlke handed out a comprehensive pamphlet of Division 10 highlights briefing on each topic. Key points of David's report will be included in the next newsletter. He then presented a fossilized egg donated by George found many years ago

# 10. General Business

a. RAAF Amberley Consultative Working Group (ACWG) Update. The ACWG meeting is a bi-monthly opportunity for discussion between Willowbank Area residents and RAAF Amberley Executives on matters of mutual interest. The RAAF recently advised that they will be holding two information sessions on the findings of the PFOS firefighting







chemical investigations on Wednesday 8 March: 2pm-4pm and 5pm-7pm. Minor traces of PFOS have been found in some water sources however they are unsure of the severity of the results at this time. International authorities are now being involved to continue this investigation. Full details of the meetings were published in local newspapers and on the WAG Facebook page.

b. Ratification of WAG Constitution and Name of Organisation. Due to administrative requirements by the Office of Fair Trading, (OFT) two further motions are required to ratify the new WAG constitution endorsed by the WAG last year and, to formally adopt the Group's name to reflect the title we are actually using. Accordingly, a special resolution was proposed, moved Lauren Loeffel and seconded by Kris Denis, that the Draft WAG constitution approved by the Group during 2016 be ratified. Carried

An additional special resolution was then proposed, moved Lauren Loeffel and seconded by Ian Dainer, that the WAG adopt the formal title Willowbank Area (Residents) Group Incorporated.

Carried

- **c. Promotion of WAG Facebook Page.** The WAG committee will provide wider community advice regarding the availability of the WAG Facebook page.
- d. Albert Theaker Park. Ian Rickuss advised that the Albert ICC Park and rest stop, just off Champion Way has now been completed and is open for use by travelers.
- **e. Ipswich Heritage Trail Willowbank Mention.** ICC has produced booklet on Heritage Trail that covers the Ipswich Rural Areas but does not include any Willowbank historical content. This oversight will be advocated by George prior to the next printing of the brochure.
- f. NBN Update. The ICC has approved the installation of 11 towers in the region for the connection of NBN services, but no tower has been approved for Willowbank due to objections by the RAAF Base. This matter will be followed up at the next ACWG meeting.
- g. Condition of Coopers Rd Canberra Bomber. Residents again sought advice on what can be done about the eyesore that is the Canberra Bomber on Coopers Road. Unfortunately, the aircraft is privately owned and sits on private property and Council has no role in forcing action to clean it up nor have the owners shown any inclination to do so.





I commend the Redistribution Commission on what is clearly hard, long, and detailed work. Having spent my adult life so far living in Hope Island and Upper Coomera (currently Upper Coomera), I largely approve of the suggested boundaries, and the new electorate names. My objections are thus: 1. Coomera (the electorate) has not in my time included Upper Coomera. This was already confusing. The proposed Coomera electorate doesn't even include all of Coomera (the suburb). I feel that it would be appropriate to change the name of the Coomera electorate, possibly to Ormeau (noting that parts of Ormeau split by the M1 have now been brought together - which I think is fantastic). 2. The Broadwater boundary brings together communities of interest very well, in my opinion. There is a small boundary change I would suggest making, however. The couple of blocks of land accessed by taking Anaheim Dr or River Links Blvd, fit in vastly better with the Broadwater electorate's community groups and interests than those of Theodore. I think a sensible boundary can be drawn using the Coomera River, the Pacific Motorway, and Hope Island Road (which is prominent and arterial) to include these homes in Broadwater. I don't know much about the additional land this would include, but Coomera River, the Pacific Motorway, and Helensvale Road could work too. 3. As a proud member of the Burdekin Community, a long term resident of Ayr, previously an elected Councillor on the Burdekin Shire Council and now a Senator in the Federal Parliament, I strongly object to the name change of this iconic seat.

The seat takes its name from the Burdekin River named after Thomas Burdekin, who sponsored the expedition which discovered this vast river. It is Australia's largest river system and has a catchment area of roughly 130,000 square kilometres. The Burdekin River system covers most of the area of the newly drawn boundaries for this electorate.

I was the member of the Council who moved a motion to rename the Ayr Shire Council, as the Shire was previously known, to the Burdekin Shire, to better reflect the Shires people and the locality for which the Council was responsible.



I am writing to express in the strongest possible terms my objection to Calliope being removed from the Gladstone electoral boundary.

Calliope is virtually a suburb of Gladstone and it is very short sighted indeed to entertain the idea that this community and closeness will not become stronger yet over the next few decades as both centres continue to grow together.

An extremely strong community of interest exists not only geographically but also along human behavioural lines/ties.

The Great Dividing Range is one defining factor that separates Monto and Calliope and links Calliope with Gladstone and water catchment areas yet another vital linking component (see map). Other community of interest attributes that strongly link Calliope and Gladstone are listed as follows but are certainly not limited to this list:

Electoral Commission recently reviewed Local Government Boundaries for amalgamation of Councils based in part on community of interest and strengthening economically each Council. The Commission in its wisdom amalgamated Gladstone/Calliope and Miriam Vale Councils to form a new Gladstone Regional Council based in part on the strong community ties between the three areas. Monto was not included in that mix and rightly so.

The new Gladstone Regional Council operates three main offices with an office in each of the three centres mentioned with Calliope being the main engineering/town planning administration centre for the new Gladstone Regional Council.

Calliope is virtually a suburb of Gladstone with the suburbs of Beecher/Burua/Calliope forming the link along the State Controlled Dawson Highway – a major thorough fair linking the two growing centres which are located a mere 20 minutes at most apart by road.

Children attending secondary schooling attend high schools in the Gladstone region and it is planned that Calliope will soon have its own secondary school. This in turn will link the educational environment of both school communities together even more as resources and inter school activities are undertaken. The University Campus and TAFE in Gladstone

services the regional tertiary needs of Calliope/Gladstone and surrounding districts. And provides yet another vital community of interest linkage between Gladstone and Calliope.

Mail services for Calliope are delivered and sorted through the Gladstone mail centre thus providing another essential service that links the two centres.

Sporting Clubs such as cricket, soccer, equestrian, rugby, rugby league, rodeos, swimming, aquatic events, basketball, horse racing all play and/or compete in a combined Gladstone /Calliope competition.

The industrial/retail/commercial hub for Calliope residents is Gladstone with a major part of the workforce of Calliope employed and invested in Gladstone. Major banks are located in Gladstone together with legal support and a host of commercial activities. Gladstone Court House services Calliope as well as Calliope being the location for the Police Departments Highway patrol units which cover the community of interest and especially along the main arterial Highways of Dawson and Bruce Highways. On the other end of the scale the State Government shut down the Calliope/Monto Railway line many years ago as a result of lack of commerce, lack of common interest in passenger and trade thus emphasising further the absence of any community of interest between the two centres. Further the two centres are linked by road or more precisely described "goat track" thus giving no inducement for an inter town relationship to develop in the slightest. This road (goat track) becomes impassable during most wet periods and is engulfed by Awoonga Dam backwater once the dam is full to overflow stage. Sections of the road were built along the lower lying flats and not on the surrounding higher ground in order to reduce costs at the time of construction however this decision comes back to haunt the engineer/designer every wet season.

Other emergency services such as ambulance paramedics/fire and rescue services and SES assist each other with joint training and support in times of emergency thus strengthening the community of interest with volunteers between the two centres. Volunteers for a host of community based services come from both Calliope and Gladstone as both centres work together with social service response volunteers and front line staff.

Medical services are accessed through the Gladstone Base Hospital and the private Mater Hospital based in Gladstone. Doctors and specialist clinics are also based in Gladstone and service Calliope residents/patients. The aged care catchment covers both Gladstone and Calliope with future aged care facilities being in direct talks at present to further strengthen this sector of support services for our region.

Tourism promotion has been developed over many years based on the community of interest in the Gladstone/Calliope/1770/ Agnes Water region.

Existing local news and the local newspaper cover the Calliope/Gladstone region providing an advertising and current content local news for the two centres.

Calliope does NOT have any of the above community of interest ties with Monto and it is unrealistic and unreasonable to assume that just in order to advance the voting numbers in one electorate over another would change any of this.





I raise two points, one serious, the other perhaps trivial.

The Redistribution places all of the Samford district in the new seat of D'Aguilar except the district of Camp Mountain which remains in Ferny Grove. Camp Mountain is about 10k from Ferny Grove by road but is an important part of Samford and Districts. The Samford valley is basically a basin surrounded by wooded mountains.

Because of this isolation the valley has developed a high level of community involvement which new residents quickly respond to.

The Camp Mountain district has not a lot of voters, the total population, including children and other non-voters was 1258 at the 2011 census. My reading of the numbers is that moving Camp Mountain with the rest of Samford into D'Aguilar would not exceed the 10% tolerance. Both seats will favour the ALP despite the the liberal tendencies of the valley.

The smaller point is the name D'Aguilar. OBJECTIONS TO PROPOSED KAWANA ELECTORATE BOUNDARIES OBJECTING TO THE PROPOSED TRANSFER OF MINYAMA, BUDDINA AND KAWANA ISLAND (PARREARRA) FROM KAWANA TO ELECTORATE OF BUDERIM It seems that a desk top process was used to redraw the electorate boundaries for the seat of Kawana without taking into account local geographical, historical or social aspects of what local residents consider is Kawana. I am therefore pleased to have the opportunity to submit my personal view of why I believe the electorate boundaries of Kawana should NOT be changed in the way you have recommended due to loss of community of interest. I am arguing for the retention of Minyama, Buddina and Parrearra (Kawana Island) in the seat of Kawana. The area known as Kawana was created in the 1960's when Alfred Grant developed a system of canals from Point Cartwright via the Mooloolah River in poor swampy land between Caloundra and Mooloolaba. These canals are in the suburbs of Buddina and Minyama. The area named Kawana then extended along the coastal strip to Currimundi Creek taking in the suburbs of Minyama, Buddina, Warana, Bokarina and Wurtulla. When driving along Nicklin Way heading north there is a sign at Currimundi Creek advising drivers that they are entering Kawana. Many residents that I know if asked where they live they will reply that they live in Queensland at Kawana rather than naming a specific suburb. This is an indication of how strong the historical and geographical identification of Kawana is locally. It will be very odd and confusing for residents who identify themselves as living in Kawana to suddenly find that they are no longer in the seat of Kawana but in the seat of Buderim when people living in the area known as Caloundra will be in Kawana. This will be especially confusing when iconic organizations, businesses and services such as Kawana Shopping World, Kawana Surf Club, Kawana Library, Kawana Ambulance Service, Kawana Community Centre and Kawana Scouts, to name a few will be in the seat of Buderim. Not to mention also that the Kawana Electorate Office is in Minyama which will no longer be in the seat of Kawana. Furthermore, the commission is placing Parrearra into Buderim but whilst Parrearra is the postal address this area is actually known as Kawana Island. For the last 20 years I have owned a house in Kawana, moving from the southern end at Wurtulla to the northern end at Minyama and can testify that strong social and business links exist throughout the area of Kawana. I can also state that I have rarely had any connection with Buderim, its people or businesses. However when residing in the south of Kawana I did have connections with Caloundra and now in the north of Kawana I have connections in Maroochydore – BUT NEVER WITH BUDERIM. The issues and concerns of leafy, quiet, hilly Buderim in the coastal hinterland are far different from those of the waterside and coastal suburbs of Minyama, Buddina and Kawana Island. Furthermore, Jarrod Bleijie MP has worked hard in this electorate to develop a strong representative relationship with his constituents and at a personal level I would be very sad to lose him as my trusted local member. I understand that you strive to balance the number of electors in each electorate and in submitting that these core original areas of Kawana, namely Minyama, Buddina and Parrearra (Kawana Island) should remain in Kawana I would suggest that the newer area of Sippy Downs, west of Kawana Way could be placed in Buderim. APPEAL AGAINST THE DECISION TO INCLUDE THE IPSWICH SUBURB OF WILLOWBANK IN THE QUEENSLAND ELECTORATE OF SCENIC RIM IAN DAINER 52 WILLOWBANK DRIVE WILLOWBANK QLD 4306 HEATHER DAINER 52 WILLOWBANK DRIVE WILLOWBANK QLD 4306 We are residents of the Ipswich City suburb of Willowbank which is currently located in the QLD Electorate of Lockyer, and following the recent review of the State's electoral boundaries, find that we are to be relocated to the Electorate of Scenic Rim. As residents of an urban city, we both profoundly object to the relocation of our suburb to a predominately rural electorate that now extends to the NSW border, and submit this objection to the proposed boundary change by the QEC. We have been residents of local govt Division 10 of the City of Ipswich since its amalgamation with Moreton Shire in 1995 and fully identify as such. We have been part of the Lockyer state electorate since first enrolling in QLD. While we have been well served as part of the Lockyer electorate, which actually has some relationship with Ipswich, the reality is that for the reasons detailed below, we are part of Ipswich and believe our interests will receive far more practical consideration by being represented as part of an electorate connected to Ipswich. In this case that is the electorate of Ipswich West. Geographical Representation: Boonah and the Scenic Rim are particularly beautiful rural and in some parts remote areas, and our objection should in no way be seen as any reflection on those areas. However, the reality is that Willowbank is an urban area connected to a very large City and all our interests; employment, services (health, transport etc), education, social and general amenity, are provided from Ipswich. We understand the electoral office for the Scenic Rim will be Boonah, approximately a 40 minute drive with no public transport options from Willowbank. Boonah is considered centric for agricultural land usage area and rural industries. However, Willowbank is physically attached to RAAF Amberley which is the source of much of our resident's employment in the high tech aerospace industry. Willowbank residents are a short drive to the Ipswich CBD and indeed closer to the Ipswich CBD than the town of Rosewood, a rural town also in Division 10 of ICC, and further west of Ipswich than Willowbank, but set to be moved from Lockyer into Ipswich West. Employment: As mentioned above, many Willowbank residents are either members of the Defence Force, or Civilian Defence employees employed on RAAF Amberley. Additionally, many other residents are employed locally in Ipswich in services and retail work, or travel further east to the commercial and industrial hub on the Brisbane fringe. Finally, we also have a significant component of residents whose work takes them to Brisbane daily. The retail centre of interest for the household requirements of Willowbank residents is nominally sourced at Yamanto, Ipswich City and Rosewood which are either included within the proposed realigned electorate of Ipswich West or in close proximity. This employment connection to Ipswich and eastern surrounds reinforces our view that our representation should be focused on urban rather than rural concerns. Education and Health. The education precincts that service Willowbank are all located in the new boundaries of Ipswich West, that is the Amberley District State School and the

Rosewood State High School (the Rosewood location in Ipswich West already having been mentioned), along with all other education institutions. Indeed, the newish Bremer State High School catchment has been expanded to include Willowbank residents. Similarly, all health services directed at Willowbank residents are also located in the Ipswich CBD. Inclusion of Willowbank in Ipswich West would allow a continuing community representation by Willowbank residents on committees and community groups attached to those facilities that align with their representation through Ipswich West. Social Amenity. As important as all the other services available for Willowbank residents either through Ipswich or Ipswich West as State responsibilities, or perhaps more pertinently, Ipswich City Council, through the Council to which we pay rates, is the social amenity enjoyed by Willowbank residents. The many varied sporting associations residents have here, the access to civic facilities, libraries, clubs and other entertainment are all part of our Ipswich community and we directly contribute to the development and upkeep of this vital infrastructure through our residency in the City of Ipswich. It would be incongruous for us to continue to maintain those links while also having to establish a connection with the greater Scenic Rim in general and the community of Boonah in particular. Community Representation. Willowbank is well served by our elected Fed, State and Local govt representatives, all of whom are part of Ipswich or it's western boundaries. In addition, Willowbank Area is also served by community representatives on several bodies including the RAAF Amberley Consultative Working Group (ACWG) which aims to keep "good neighbour" relations between the RAAF Base and its surrounding communities, the Ipswich City Town and Country Consultative Group that allows the regional Ipswich City communities, all of which, excluding Willowbank, will remain or move into West Ipswich, to relay their concerns directly to Council and State Govt, and the Willowbank Area (Residents) Group (the WAG) that interacts on behalf of the Willowbank Area residents directly with all three levels of Govt. I am a community representative on all three of these bodies and in recent meetings since the boundaries review announcement, Willowbank residents have expressed their concerns about relocating to the Scenic Rim. In addition to those bodies we both hold several voluntary positions in the Ex service communities and all our efforts in these activities are directed toward Ipswich. It would be totally impractical for us to now turn our efforts to another community. Public Transport. The above relocation concerns have been specifically raised by some of our older residents living in the Willowbank Palm Village. Most of these older folk rely heavily on public transport to access services provided in Ipswich and if they had to travel to Boonah, would simply not able to do so as there is no public transport connectivity between Willowbank and Boonah. Summary. The community of Willowbank has a long standing historical, geographical, commercial and recreational association with the localities of west Ipswich and Ipswich itself, and therefore it is not just for the rational reasons outlined above that they should be included in the electorate of West Ipswich for parliamentary representation, but perhaps also for the genuine affection residents develop for their immediate residential area and its surrounds. We both therefore submit our objection to the proposal of Willowbank being transferred from the electorate of Lockyer to the electorate of Scenic Rim and request that Willowbank, for the reasons outlined above, be transferred to the electorate of Ipswich West. 
I wish to raise concerns regarding the draft redistribution proposals for part of the boundary between the seats of Miller and Toohey, as well as some of the proposed names of some electorates.

## The boundary between proposed Miller and Toohey through Moorooka

My concern with the proposed boundary is with how and where Moorooka is split. I note in the report of the desire of the QRC to stick with easily identifiable boundaries like major roads, watercourses, LGA boundaries and the like as well as the imperative to keep communities of interest together as much as possible. It appears that the Commission has ignored these tenets when drawing the boundary through Moorooka. It is appreciated and noted the limitations with which the Commission needs to keep enrolments within tolerances however, I do not see how splitting Moorooka through the middle of the Moorvale shopping area , or placing businesses in the Moorooka Miracle Mile into two separate electorates through the use of Ipswich Road, meets the community of interest criteria, nor having the boundary line through an obscure side street meet the criteria of easily identifiable boundaries. If Moorooka is to be split between two electorates, the logical boundary to use is Beaudesert Road, not the combination of Beaudesert and Ipswich Roads via Lyon Street.

Lyon Street is a street which limits through traffic at either end. At Ipswich Road, it is only left in, left out and the access at Beaudesert Road is blocked by a community park/pedestrian area which is the heart of the Moorvale shopping precinct. It also places the Woolworths shopping centre, the focal point of the Moorooka community, in an electorate separate from the vast bulk of the rest of the suburb. The use of Lyon Street also splits a common community of interest which lies in the wedge bounded by Ipswich and Beaudesert Roads as well as Muriel Avenue, or the Beenleigh railway line if to incorporate the handful of houses south of Muriel Avenue. No street between Ipswich and Beaudesert Roads could be classed as easily identifiable as a boundary, except Muriel Avenue, as they are all small suburban streets with traffic calming elements. I would respectfully propose that moving the Lyon Street boundary south to either Muriel Avenue or the Beenleigh railway would create a stronger boundary and unite the vast majority of residential and commercial interests of Moorooka into one seat within a split suburb. I accept though that this proposal places the urban areas of Rocklea in a position that it could be placed in any one of three electorates - Miller, Toohey or Algester. Given that the Beenleigh railway line would be as strong a boundary as Granard Road, those parts of Rocklea between Granard Road the the Beenleigh railway line could be incorporated into Algester or Miller. This proposal would make Beaudesert Road a continuous electoral boundary most of the way along its length from Browns Plains to Mayfield Road.

Given the loss of electors that Toohey has with this change, it could be proposed that additional electors could be added with a minor adjustment to the boundary between Toohey and Stretton in the Fruitgrove locality. Rather than using Bonemill and Daw Roads as the boundary between Toohey and Stretton, a much stronger boundary of Beenleigh and Warrigal Roads would be more easily identifiable. The maps provided indicates the changes proposed in my objection.



## **Proposed electorate names**

Given the enormity of this redistribution, it was inevitable there were going to be some major name changes to some seats. The Commission should be commended for some of the choices made for electorate names, especially in using Maiwar and Oodgeroo, and trying to honour Queenslanders that have contributed positively to their communities. I do feel however, that there is still a need to try and use, where possible, geographical identifiers in electorate names. Where it is difficult to use geography, the use of prominent Queenslanders would be appropriate if that person had links with the community covered by that electorate. There is also scope to use historical electorate names in some districts. I especially note the use of Macalister and Theodore. While both are former premiers, both are also towns in Queensland that were not covered by the electorates they were proposed for. This could be a source of confusion for some voters and so neither would be appropriate for electorate names at this point. I would be more supportive of these names if Theodore was the new name for Callide and if Macalister was the new name for Warrego as the towns of Theodore and Macalister are found in the electorates of Callide and Warrego respectively. The table below summarises my suggestions for various electorate names.

I wish to lodge my objection to the community of Miles and Chinchilla being placed in the electorate of Callide.

Our communities have very little to do with the towns to the north and everything in common with the towns along the transport corridor of the Warrego highway.

I have not seen any plausible reason why we would be split from our shire. It is disappointing that the redistribution commission cannot see that obvious connection.

Both Miles and Chinchilla are in the Surat Basin and have no community of interest with the north as they are situated in a different resource basin, catchment, local government areas and state department regional boundaries that run in an east west direction.

The clear community of interest on the Western Downs (ie Miles and Chinchilla) is in the east west direction and follows the Warrego highway.

With respect, I urge the commission to consider how to keep Miles and Chinchilla within the Warrego electorate as the current draft will diminish our ability to have access to state government representation due to the natural barriers and lack of direct transport routes.

It is very unlikely we would see an elected member this far down in the electorate, whereas the current member passes through Miles regularly.

Good afternoon. I would like to make a submission on the proposed boundary changes for the Hervey Bay and Maryborough electorates. I currently reside in Urraween which is within the Hervey Bay electorate. The new boundary places my property in the Maryborough electorate. I believe that the boundary changes as proposed are incorrect and should be amended for the following reasons: 1. demographic trends: - Hervey Bay (City) is spreading south into Nikenbah and for that reason all these urban areas including Urraween should remain in the Hervey Bay electorate. These residential areas of Urraween and Nikenbah are part of Hervey Bay (City) and are serviced by facilities, shopping, etc in Hervey Bay not Maryborough and as such residents in these areas should have a vote in the area that is seen as their electorate. There is no demographic commonality with Maryborough and its hinterland to the west, and south. 2.community of interest: - The areas of Urraween and Nikenbah are part of Hervey Bay (City) and that is where there social, economic and regional interests are tied. There is no commonality or relationship with Maryborough (City) which is some 30 kms to the south. The interests of the local residents are closely tied to areas/suburbs in the Hervey Bay City area and not Maryborough and its hinterland. The voting base for the local Maryborough MP is in Maryborough and the hinterland, and not in the small urban area proposed to be excised out of Hervey Bay. It is illogical to take this Hervey Bay locality out of the Hervey Bay electorate and place it into an electorate that has no social, economic and local connectivity. Residents in these areas should have a vote in the area that is seen as their electorate for social and economic purposes. 3.communication and travel - As per above the daily travel, communication, etc in Urraween and Nikenbah are north into Hervey Bay (City) and not to Maryborough (City) which is some 30kms away. Residents in these areas should have a vote in the area that is seen as their electorate for communication and travel purposes 4.the physical features of each proposed district - the physical features and proposed urban development in Urraween and Nikenbah link it closely to Hervey Bay (City). Urraween immediately adjoins Kawungan, and other residential areas whereas the area to the south of Urraween and Nikenbah is rural in nature and links more closely with rural areas between Maryborough and Hervey Bay. The physical linkage of Nikenbah and Urraween is with Hervey Bay and not Maryborough. Residents in these areas should have a vote in the area that is seen as their electorate due to physical linkages. 5. My alternative suggestion is to make Chapel Rd, Maggs Hill Rd, Hebblewhite Road and then Booral Road as the northern boundary of the Maryborough electorate to bring all the larger rural areas, Booral, River Heads, etc into Maryborough electorate and leave the area north of Booral Rd, Chapel Rd, Maggs Hill Rd in the Hervey Bay electorate to reflect the current and proposed urban linkages of Urraween and Nikenbah to the actual city of Hervey Bay. This would mean the urban areas of Hervey Bay (City) stay within the Hervey Bay electorate whereas the rural areas west and south of the urban area would be part of the Maryborough electorate. In closing I would submit that there is no sound basis to include the areas of Urraween or Nikenbah into the Maryborough electorate. The proposed boundary changes appear to be a simple map based excision of an area without consideration of the actual circumstances that exist on the ground. This submission is to note my concern about altering the electoral boundary which will move Rainbow Beach into the Noosa Electorate, and therefore would like to retain the current connection to the Gympie region.

- Rainbow Beach, Cooloola Cove and Tin Can Bay function as an urban unit. Living in Rainbow Beach we do not have the services one would expect to find in a small town. These are accessed from the above as well as Gympie. For example, there is no permanent medical service. The part time Doctors here are based in Tin Can Bay as well as the Police who basically have a depot here.
- Grocery shopping is mostly carried out in Cooloola Cove. Even that involves about a 45km. round trip, and frequent trips to Gympie, about 160km return for many other Government, or other services one needs for life.
- Our monthly Community News connects us as well.

By separating us from our established network of community and general services links, I anticipate political and logistic problems when issues have to be raised between two parties to deal with what is presently the province of one local representative.

- Noosa is at the southern corner of the Electorate, Rainbow Beach at the northern tip. The
  only sealed road passes through Gympie. Return travel time around three and a half
  hours. One would have the illogical situation where practically the total Noosa electorate
  is along the southern boundary and we in Rainbow Beach or the M.P. for Noosa would
  have to make this journey, to the extent of having to drive through Gympie.
- This is a different situation where urban electorates with issues contentious or otherwise may be separated by only a few streets.

Finally, on a personal note. Noosa is another country, geographically distant and from Rainbow on the road to nowhere. A detour on the way to Brisbane if we need to travel there once or twice a year, while we average about 25 journeys a year to Gympie.

It is with disappointment as I see the new electorates which seem to disadvantage the north. I have to admit it seems we have not moved from the mentality of the "Brisbane Line."

I recall the write up in the Register some time back, where councillor Jackson took a week to travel to a council meeting in Cooktown from his property on the Cape.

Our electorate of Dalrymple has been well looked after by Shane Knuth, who has experienced this scenario at the last redistribution. There is a vast area in Cook and now Traeger with such a variety of needs. Cook has at least seven indigenous settlements, vast areas of national parks, mining, fishing, tourism and cattle properties. Traeger now has three settlements, fishing, cattle with the live cattle export. Mining which Mt. Isa is one of the biggest and richest mines in the country. How can this all be managed with two representatives. There is the agricultural areas of the Atherton Tablelands and the Mareeba and Dimbulah area.

Regardless of who our members are it is a mammoth undertaking and very unfair. I know it goes on population but the mining in Weipa has a fly in work force along with some of the other mining ventures. The agricultural sector rely on backpackers and overseas workers which add to our population and have to be catered for. Safety, health and welfare all put demands on Government services, along with water and roads and education standards. Our outback children are already disadvantaged, having to look at boarding from grade 7. If you are an indigenous family one is lucky enough to have Gov., assistance in education fees and board but this does not cover everyone.

I personally had the experience of travelling with the Anglican Church team to attend a monthly ministry into the Gulf. We received wonderful hospitality but the trip took 4days, along with 4 punctured tires and fuel trouble. While at a motel in Normanton someone tried to steal our fuel and left a piece of hose which caused a blockage. This could have been dangerous as the car was filled with fumes etc..

I only relate these incidents to argue the pitfalls of isolation and distance which seemed to be overlooked. All I ask is the Government gives the Northern residents a fair go.

While I absolutely agree in one-vote one-value, both as a concept and an instrument for equity, I do not believe that the mathematical imperative should or ever need to over-ride community realities. To move the northern end of Kawana to Buderim is akin to the magician sawing a person in half. There's no reason, other than the mathematical convenience of an algorithmic balancing act. While I am aware that boundaries have to change to reflect changing numerical realities, I'd like the Electoral Commission to resharpen its pencil and perhaps look at an alternative where nothing was broken and didn't need fixing. My only other point I'd like to make is that I am not nor have I ever been the member of any political party, and the politics of the issue are not of my interest.

At tonight's meeting of this Association, it was resolved to submit this submission regarding the redistribution between the proposed electorates of **FERNY GROVE** and **D'Aguilar**.

At present the electorate of Ferny Grove contains all of the Samford Valley localities including Highvale, Closeburn, Samford Village, Camp Mountain, Wights Mountain etc.

Under the proposed redistribution the locality of **Camp Mountain** will stay in Ferny Grove electorate but the rest of the Samford Valley localities will become part of the D'Aquilar electorate.

This Association sees this move as very detrimental for the following reasons;

- 1/ The State political representation for the Samford Valley area would be split between two electorates with a subsequent loss of cohesion across the localities of the Samford Valley, and
- 2/ There would be a lot of confusion for Camp Mountain residents when it came to voting in State elections. At present they vote along with the rest of the Samford Valley electorates at the polling booth in Samford Village. Under this redistribution if they tried to vote at the Samford booth they would not be on the electoral roll and would have to drive to Ferny Grove to a booth or possibly submit an absentee vote if possible.

3/ The Samford Valley area has well defined physical boundaries - the watershed formed by the surrounding mountains (Mt Nebo, Mt Glorious, Camp Mountain, Clear Mountain etc.). The area has a long history of local identity, unusually strong local community groups including the Rural Fire Brigade, Show Society, Pony Club, Samford Commons, Soccer and Rugby League Clubs, and the Progress Association. Also the area was historically included in the Pine Rivers electorate before the Ferny Grove electorate was formed. The Samford Valley area, including Camp Mountain is in the Moreton Bay Regional Council area, which also includes the proposed electorate of D'Aguilar.

The local and state boundaries would be more in line if Camp Mountain was included in the D'Aguilar electorate and this would lessen confusion for many residents. 4/ As the Camp Mountain locality consists of mainly small acreage blocks and parklands, the number of voters would not be significant in relation to the total number of voters in both Ferny Grove and D'Aguilar, therefore the impact of a change would not be significant.

In closing I would like to thank you for the opportunity to present these concerns to the Commission, and I trust that they will be given due consideration.

There are few similarities between the hinterland, hill-based area (Buderim) and the three beach-side suburbs. Buderim is outside the designated development corridor and future transport nodes that are designated for the Buddina/Parrearra/Minyama areas in the future. Buderim has its own issues around development densities and access that are simply not replicated in Buddina, Parrearra or Minyama. Any representative elected under the name Buderim would have great difficulty in working out their priorities given the very separate geographical, demographic and economic nature of Buderim versus Buddina, Parrearra and Minyama. I understand the need for regular electoral redistribution, but find it difficult to accept the proposed removal of Buddina from the Kawana Electorate, to be absorbed into Buderim. Historically, Buddina was the first area to be settled when Kawana Waters opened up for development in the 1960's. The focus of our early residents was to create a local community, as is evidenced by the number of groups which now include "Kawana" in their title – Girl Guides, Scouts, Lifesavers, RSL, Tennis Club etc. The building of Kawana Shoppingworld, Kawana Hotel, Kawana Library, Kawana Community Hall and Kawana Ambulance Station confirmed Buddina as the hub of the area. Council has resolved to formally object to the proposed redistribution of electoral boundaries for the State seat of Herbert.

For the reasons hereinafter mentioned, Council is of the opinion that the Commission has not properly considered the communities of interest criteria.

The current boundaries of the Hinchinbrook Electorate encompass rural coastal communities situated between the major regional centres of Cairns and Townsville with economies that are heavily reliant on primary industries and related manufacturing.

The current external boundaries reflect the common interests of the seat with the main focus being agricultural based and the need to protect, enhance and support livelihood and life based upon agriculture.

If the recommendations are accepted, the Hinchinbrook Electorate demographic will shift from an agriculture base to an urban base, given that the majority of the population of Hinchinbrook will then reside in the northern most suburbs of Townsville City, south of Crystal Creek where minimal agriculture occurs.

Because of the overwhelming majority of population, the focus of the Hinchinbrook Electorate will convert to urban based issues to the detriment of the seat's current rural lifestyle and dependency.

It is estimated that two thirds of the electorate will actually reside in the Townsville City Council area. It is general knowledge that under the terms of the Local Government Reform Commission, it was not considered appropriate for the local authority of Hinchinbrook to be amalgamated with Townsville City as little or no community of interest existed. This situation has not changed and this argument cannot be discounted at a State Electorate level.



It is already accepted that a great divide exists in the ideology of representatives whom represent the urban or rural electorates. If this recommendation is accepted, further decline in rural representation will occur as the character of the Hinchinbrook district as a rural community will change due to the urban centric focus that will be generated.

If reform must occur, it would be more beneficial for the Hinchinbrook district to be maintained within the Cassowary Coast Region given the commonality of economic and community interest that exists.

Various statutory and non-statutory associations, including Local Governments, in the existing seat boundaries continue to put considerable effort into strengthening relationships for the common good of their respective agricultural based communities through matters such as joint natural resource protection, agriculture based environmental sustainability and pest control to name a few. These are issues shared in common within the area due to current location within the wet tropics habitat and strong State representation on such issues as funding, research and development is needed. These very important issues do not apply south of Crystal Creek, given that such area is located in the dry tropics bio-region. There are no issues or linkages to the immediate major issues faced by our existing agricultural community in the dry tropics bio-region.

Council urges the Commission to consider aligning the northern boundary of Hinchinbrook with more of the communities in the Cassowary Coast Region as against the unchanged northern suburbs of Townsville City Council as no common attributes exist.



We live within the current Kawana electorate area.

We wish to strongly object to the proposed alterations to the boundaries of Kawana electorate & Buderim electorate.

1. The ECQ Redistribution Commission's proposed removal of the beach/canal coastal suburbs of Minyama, Buddina and Parrearra from the Kawana electorate is an absolute non-sense.

These suburbs are part of the coastal strip from Mooloolaba and Caloundra which is referred to locally as Kawana Waters, or just Kawana. The suburbs of Birtinya, Bokarina, Buddina, Minyama, Parrearra, Warana and Wurtulla, are all part of this coastal strip. Kawana Beach runs from Currimundi Lake to Point Cartwright, a feature adjacent to the suburbs along the coastal strip. It would be counter-intuative to remove a portion of 'Kawana' and move it to Buderim, an area associated with a 'mountain' and its adjacent slopes. Buderim has very little in common with the coastal/beach suburbs of Kawana, and the needs of the constituents vary greatly

There are a number of community organisations which operate along the coastal strip proposed to become part of Buderim electorate, which have **NO** connection with Buderim. These include: Kawana Waters RSL Sub-Branch, Kawana Waters Surf Lifesaving Club, Kawana Library, Kawana Scouts, Kawana Community Centre, Kawana Rotary Club, Lake Currimundi-Kawana Lions Club, Kawana Waters Chamber of Commerce, Buddina State School, Minyama Neighbour Watch, Kawana Champions, Kawana Seniors and the Kawana Island Residents Association. Indeed many of these organisations form the cultural heart of Kawana – they **MUST REMAIN IN THE KAWANA ELECTORATE**!

Equally organizations such as Buderim Lions, Buderim Scouts, Buderim War Memorial Community Association, Buderim Cricket Club are largely confined to the traditional (Pre 1959) area of Buderim, which existed prior to the coastal Kawana Waters development.

The Buderim Member of Parliament will logically maintain an office in the Buderim village which bears the name of the electorate. Buderim is an older retiree community which was traditionally rural, and centered around Buderim itself. An office in Buderim would remain out of context with the Kawana Waters coastal strip constituents.

Residents of Kawana suburbs rely on the Kawana strip for their work, business, social, educational, medical, community, sport, cultural and shopping needs. Kawana Shoppingworld is a major transport hub as well as a shopping centre, linking with the Sunshine Coast University Hospital and other transport

destinations throughout the Kawana area. The Kawana Waters Hotel should remain in the Kawana electorate as it serves as a social centre & meeting hub for Kawana residents.

# 2. Proposed inclusion of Sippy Downs into the Buderim Electorate

If the three suburbs of Minyama, Buddina and Parrearra were to be returned to the electorate of Kawana, a suitable offset for Buderim would be the suburb of Sippy Downs, which is more closely associated with Buderim.

Sippy Downs is a better fit by way of geography, road access and schools. In particular in the school catchments of Buderim State, Sienna, Chancellor Park and Mountain Creek Schools, the students frequently move from primary to secondary levels or between the schools. The local Lions Club is active in the traditional Buderim electorate as well as Sippy Downs.

It does not extend its activities to the Kawana area. The local newspaper distribution area coincides with the common postcode of 4556, shared by Buderim and Sippy Downs. Community activities spread from Buderim to the growth suburb of Sippy Downs. This was a logical progression, as both areas had a common rural background, and there was a considerable area of vegetation between the growing beach/coastal Kawana Waters area and Buderim/Sippy Downs suburbs.

# To summarise we are strongly in favour of:

- Maintaining the suburbs of Minyama, Buddina and Parrearra and maintaining the cultural heart of Kawana in the existing Kawana electorate.
- Extending the Buderim electorate to include the suburb of Sippy Downs as a logical offset to maintaining Minyama, Buddina and Parrearra in the existing Kawana electorate..





To whom it may concern, I was recently informed that the suburbs of Buddina (my home suburb), Minyama and Parrearra are to be joined to the Buderim electoral division. I would like to summarize some reasons why I object to this: 1. Buddina is closer to the other suburbs in the Kawana electorate than Buderim, so geographically speaking, this makes little sense. Furthermore, the culture and landscape of Buderim is very different to that at Buddina (hilly suburbia vs coastal) and thus requirements for people differ greatly. 2. As one of many young people of the region, it is important that our voice is heard, as we are the generation of the future. I am concerned that if Buddina becomes part of Buderim, we will become forgotten about and our voice not heard from all the way at Buderim. 3. The region has been part of the Kawana Waters umbrella for around 60 years now, and I see no reason to change it, which begs the question- why now? Why have no other regions changed? 4. As a local, my partner and I often trek to the beautiful Point Cartwright Lighthouse park and surrounds. It is important we have a local MP who knows the region and it's people in order to make decisions about the conservation of such a region. 5. Many businesses (including Kawana Shopping World) feature the name 'Kawana' in their business name or motto e.g. 'the best in Kawana'. Having to change this to 'Buderim' would not be good for business. Leaving names as is would potentially be misleading and create confusion for customers. My wife and I live in and we have several major objections to the proposed excision of Buddina, Minyama and Parrearra from the Kawana electorate and their addition to the Buderim electorate.

- 1. We feel that this is a retrograde draft proposal which, if implemented, will isolate us from the broader and well established coastal community between Mooloolaba and Caloundra. This is a community with which we have similar lifestyles and well established common social, organisational, developmental and representational requirements.
- 2. Neither my wife and I nor our community at large have any common linkages with Buderim. None of their established community groups and support organisations have any representation from our coastal communities, and vice versa. There are few if any cultural or business connections between Buderim and the coastal communities. They are a hinterland community with far different social and developmental needs from the coastal strip.
- 3. Establishment of the local MP's office in Buderim will result in even further disconnect for coastal residents due to the incovenient travel distance involved when seeking advice/assistance/representation. The current location of the MP's office in Minyama is central to a functioning contact between all coastal residents and their representative. Public transport links from the coast to Buderim are neither convenient nor inexpensive. I have just seen the proposed Kawana Electoral Boundary changes and as a long term resident of the area it appears to me to be without any logical reasoning.

When I purchased land in the area in the mid 1980's I believed I was buying in Kawana Waters but in reality it was in Minyama.

Kawana Waters is the unofficial name for the coastal stretch of land between Mooloolaba and Caloundra and is the commonly referred to name of our area.

It has the Mooloolah River as a natural northern boundary and why this needs to change to secure a larger area for Buderim is hard to fathom.

I am concerned that by moving Minyama, Buddina and Parreara into the Buderim electorate, the suburbs and residents will lose true local representation and be forced into an electorate that they have no culture of business connections to.

Residents will be forced to drive to the top of Buderim on an extremely congested road, with little or no parking, to visit their local MP which will result in less engagement between the community and its elected representative.

The Electorate of Kawana is predominately a coastal urban electorate. Buderim Falls between the business district of Maroochydore and Nambour.
